From our Principal:

Remote and Flexible Learning Again

Staff were busy yesterday afternoon and first thing this morning, collaboratively preparing for the recommencement of Remote and Flexible Learning which will continue next week. We would like to acknowledge the staff for their flexibility and 'can do' attitude to maintaining learning continuity for the students. Daily Morning Meetings continue launching the day's learning tasks, helping to clarify any questions, providing time for a wellbeing check-in and marking the attendance roll.

Supporting student engagement and wellbeing remains a key priority and we acknowledge that during any period of lockdown and Remote and Flexible Learning, maintaining contacts can be challenging. Wellbeing conferences along with academic mini-lessons/conferences will continue to ensure there is meaningful connections and engagement with peers and the teacher throughout next week. Keep an eye out next week for another stimulating Maths session for students in Year 3-6 conducted by Paul and Jack our Primary Mathematics Specialists.

A separate document outlining our approach to this short period of Remote and Flexible Learning will be sent out via Compass Newsfeed today. We appreciate the ongoing support that parents/carers provide and understand that every lockdown has its challenges for families and also staff. Therefore, we appreciate whatever effort is made and encourage parents/carers to contact the teacher or leadership at school if specific support is needed. While completion of all learning tasks is important, we understand that in some instances, families need to prioritise tasks to suit their family arrangements. Like every other time, we simply ask that families do the best they can.

ZOOM Trivia Tonight + an Additional Live Event

Tonight's ZOOM Trivia Night will still go ahead and we hope to see lots of Bell faces on the screens when Disco Dave weaves his magic. As clearly outlined in the communications leading up to tonight, the back-up plan was always the ZOOM night even though the preference was to deliver the event at Thornbury Theatre. Regrettably, COVID restrictions made it not viable and the trivia team (in consultation with me) had to make that tough decision early last week that the live event could not occur at this point in time. Hi my name is Peter and I'm in Grade 1B.


My mum's name is Lisa Weightman and she is a marathon runner.

Go Grade 1s!














From the Maths Team:
