From our Principal:

Information Nights

It was wonderful to see a good number of parents/carers attend the face-to-face sessions this week and we appreciate the re-organisation of family life to attend. After some deep reflection and acknowledging there are some clear benefits to running the meetings online, we felt it was important to re-open the doors to families as a step towards re-connecting the Bell community. Teacher-parent/carer partnerships are grounded in meaningful relationships and being in the same room is far more personable.

A few key points to follow on from the sessions are:

- The slideshows and transcript of the Q&A are being posted by teams for each grade level as soon as practical after the session.
- The post will remain 'pinned' on your Compass home page for the entire term for easy access. Remember, the
 Term 1 Learning Support Document is embedded in the slides as a handy reference to promote questions and
 discussions at home about what topics are being taught in class. It will be posted on the website under the
 'Communications' tab.
- The Parent Information post will remain near the top of your Compass Newsfeed for a period of time and is also on the website under 'Communications' tab; click here for the link.
- **Teacher emails** are listed at the end of the slides if you need them. Saving them in your contacts is always a good way to keep communications simple. We hope to circulate some guidelines around email communication soon as part of the ongoing work on our communication strategy.
- Think about joining the re-branded 'Community Engagement and FUNdraising Committee' that School Councillors, Vanessa and Ceinwen, spoke about at the meetings. A separate Newsfeed was sent to parents last night as a follow on from the meetings, and a repeated call out is included in this week's Newsletter.

School Council Elections

There are three parent representative positions to be decided in the upcoming elections; self-nominations will be available at the office from Monday morning. The timeline for the election process is as follows:

Notice of Election and call for Nominations:
 Friday 16 February
 Monday 20 February

• Closing date for Nominations: Monday 27 February at 4.00pm

List of eligible candidates will be posted in our Newsletter: Friday 3 March

• Ballot papers will be prepared and distributed (if required): Wednesday 8 March

Close of Ballot (if required): Wednesday 15 March

If an election is required, more detailed information about the process and candidates' requirements will be distributed to the school community. For details about the role of School Council, see the attached *Fact Sheet 1:* School Council elections—information for parents.

Those parents/carers who require a self-nomination form, pick one up from the office or contact the admin staff who can email the PDF form. The office staff will also provide a document outlining roles and responsibilities of School Council. This gives details about the distinction between responsibilities of Council compared to the role of the Principal. Alternatively, feel free to contact me directly about council elections and related topics regarding school governance.

COVID/Infectious Disease Reminders

A reminder about the key safety actions we are asked to employ as they are strongly recommended by DET. These include:

- Students and staff who test positive to COVID-19 stay home and isolate for five days, and do not attend school after five days if they are still symptomatic.
- Any student or staff member who is unwell should continue to remain at home unless symptoms are linked to a pre-existing condition such as hay fever.
- Free rapid antigen tests are available from the front office for those who need them.
- Like last year, parents/carers should inform the school of a positive case so we can track numbers and report to DET within a confidential system.

Further COVID-19 prevention measures employed daily at school include: basic hygiene strategies, air purifiers and increased ventilation, using outside spaces when practical, and optional mask wearing.

School Council Election:

Appendix A

Fact sheet 1: school council elections – information for parents

What is a school council and what does it do?

All government schools in Victoria have a school council. They are legally constituted bodies that are given powers to set the broad direction of a school, in accordance with Ministerial Order 1280 Constitution of Government School Councils, and the *Education and Training Reform Act 2006*. In doing this, a school council may directly influence the quality of education for students.

Who is on the school council?

For most primary school councils, there are several possible categories of membership:

- A mandated elected parent member category more than one-third of the total members must be from this category according to Ministerial Order 1280.
 Department employees can be parent members at their child's school providing that they are not engaged in work at the school.
- A mandated elected school employee member category – members of this category make up no more than one-third of membership. The principal of the school is automatically one of these members.
- An optional community member category members are co-opted by a decision of the council because of their special skills, interests or experience. Department employees are not eligible to be community members.
- A small number of school councils have nominee members.

For all schools with a Year 7 and above cohort, there is an additional category of membership:

 A mandated elected student member category, two positions.

Generally, the term of office for all members is two years. The term of office of half the members expires each year, creating vacancies for the annual school council elections.

Why is parent membership so important?

Parents on school councils provide important viewpoints and have valuable skills and a range of experiences and knowledge that can help inform and shape the direction of the school.

Those parents who become active on a school council find their involvement satisfying and may also find that their children feel a greater sense of belonging.

Do I need special experience to be on school council?

Each member brings their own valuable skills and knowledge to the role, however, in order to successfully perform their duties, councillors may need to gain some new skills and knowledge.

It is important to have an interest in your child's school and the desire to work in partnership with others to help shape the school's future.

Code of conduct for school councillors

School councils in Victoria are public entities as defined by the *Public Administration Act 2004*.

School councillors must comply with the Code of Conduct for Directors of Victorian Public Entities issued by the Victorian Public Sector Commission. The Code of Conduct is based on the Victorian public sector values and requires councillors to:

- act with honesty and integrity be truthful, open and clear about their motives and declare any real, potential or perceived conflict of interest and duty
- act in good faith in the best interests of the school

 work cooperatively with other councillors and the school community, be reasonable, and make all decisions with the best interests of students foremost in their minds
- act fairly and impartially consider all relevant facts of an issue before making a decision, seek to have a balanced view, never give special treatment to a person or group and never act from self-interest
- use information appropriately respect confidentiality and use information for the purpose for which it was made available
- exercise due care, diligence and skill accept responsibility for decisions and do what is best for the school
- use the position appropriately not use the position as a councillor to gain an advantage
- act in a financially responsible manner observe all the above principles when making financial decisions
- comply with relevant legislation and policies know what legislation and policies are relevant for which decisions and obey the law
- demonstrate leadership and stewardship set a good example, encourage a culture of accountability, manage risks effectively, exercise care and responsibility to keep the school strong and sustainable.

Principals guide to school council elections 2023

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Indemnity for school council members

School councillors are indemnified against any liability in respect of any loss or damage suffered by the council or any other person in respect of anything necessarily or reasonably done, or omitted to be done by the councillor in good faith in:

- a. the exercise of a power or the performance of a function of a councillor, or
- b. the reasonable belief that the act or omission was in the exercise of a power or the performance of a function of a council.

In other words, school councillors are not legally liable for any loss or damage suffered by council or others as a result of reasonable actions taken in good faith.

How can you become involved?

By participating in, and voting in the school council elections, which are held in Term 1 each year. However, ballots are only held if more people nominate as candidates than there are positions vacant.

In view of this, you might consider:

- standing for election as a member of the school council
- encouraging another person to stand for election.

What do you need to do to stand for election?

The principal will issue a Notice of Election and Call for nominations in Term 1 of each year. Council elections must be completed by 31 March, unless varied by the Minister for Education.

If you stand for election, you can arrange for someone to nominate you as a candidate or, you can nominate yourself in the parent member category. You can only be nominated by another member of the same category that you are eligible for (e.g. a member of the parent electorate may only nominate another parent of that electorate).

Department employees with a child enrolled at a school where they are not engaged in work, are eligible to nominate for parent membership at that school.

Return your completed nomination form to the principal within the time stated on the Notice of Election. You will receive a Nomination Form Receipt via post, email or by hand delivery.

Generally, if there are more nominations than vacancies a ballot will be conducted in the two weeks after the call for nominations has closed.

Remember

- · Consider standing for election to school council.
- Ask the principal for instructions if you are not sure what to do.
- Be sure to vote if the election goes to ballot.
- Contact the principal if you are unsure about what is required at any stage of the election process.

There are a few limited places available to start now – in particular Prep and Grade 2 Keyboard/Piano classes and Grade 3 Guitar group.




