# **Student Leadership**

We are well on the way to delivering our extended leadership program with some of the Grade 6 positions now finalised and all Junior School Council (JSC) positions filled within the Grade 3-6 areas.

JSC and House Captains will be presented with their badges at this Monday's assembly and the next phase of leadership applications for a plethora of Grade 6 leadership roles will be processed in the coming weeks.

Our vision with leadership, in particular Grade 6, is to provide as many meaningful opportunities as feasible with the aim of every Grade 6 having a position of responsibility.

JSC is still an important part of the program, providing leadership opportunities from Grade 3 upwards. We will continue building on all aspects of student agency each year to foster a leadership mindset for our middle to upper level students.

#### **School Council Elections**

With the second round of nominations due to close this afternoon at 4pm, it is likely we will have an election for the two remaining vacancies. If that is the case, a Newsfeed will be sent out Monday outlining the process, and ballot papers will be sent home with the eldest child in your family by Wednesday.


