# From our Principal:

#### **School Council Elections**

The voting for School Council elections has commenced with ballot packages sent home with the eldest child yesterday. Key points are:

- We have 6 candidates for the 2 remaining vacancies, so you must mark 2 candidates only on the ballot paper.
- There is a ballot box at the front office to post votes <u>and</u> register your name. If your child is dropping off the envelope, they must tell the office staff so your name can be registered.
- Ballot closes at 4.00pm on Wednesday 15 March.
- Please read the instructions on the ballot paper carefully when casting your vote in the coming week.

#### NAPLAN for Grade 3 and 5

Grade 3 and 5 students will be completing this state-wide assessment program over the next few weeks, with most tasks conducted online. These national tests are one aspect of a rigorous and targeted assessment schedule that the school implements throughout the year. This is the first time it has been done in Term 1, which means results will be available much earlier that previous years.

The results provide us with a snapshot of each child's progress in the core learning areas of English and Maths, however they should not be taken in isolation. They will enable us to cross reference with other assessment data and evidence to support future learning for individuals, groups and the entire cohorts. At a school level, the aggregated data is used to track certain aspects of our school performance and assist us to identify areas for targeted improvement over time.

#### Maths Family Fun Night

Our Primary Maths Specialists, Paul Nicholson and Jack Fray, are planning a stimulating and exciting night of mathematical fun later this term. The aim is to showcase a range of Maths concepts through a variety of activities that both you and your child/ren can engage in. Lifting the profile of Maths and improving the attitude and confidence when attempting Numeracy tasks is a key focus, as we know a positive disposition in this essential learning area is crucial for the overall academic progress for every child. This community event will be held in the Learning Centre and upstairs in the 5/6 Learning Hub on Monday 27 March. More details to come soon but do your best to save that date.

Rapid Antigen Tests are still available from the front office.


