School Council Elections

After counting the votes for the remaining two vacancies, I would like to declare **Ciannon Cazaly** (parent of Jo in 2A) and **Mia McDonald** (parent of Sidney in 1C) the successful candidates. They join **Vaia Smirneos** (parent of Vasilis in Prep A) as the three new parent representative members of Council. The next School Council meeting will be on Thursday 23 March with the appointment of President, Vice-President, Secretary and Treasurer who will join me as the Executive group within this important governance body of the school.

Celebrations of Learning

All year level teams will be scheduling sessions throughout the year for what we are calling 'Celebrations of Learning'. Each team will run some *drop-in* and celebrate sessions with a different focus each term to showcase the learning within the key areas of Literacy, Numeracy and Inquiry (one each term). Individual Compass Newsfeeds will go out prior to the date for each cohort showcase, providing options to drop in at the beginning or end of the day.

This is an initiative that we had hoped to expand on back in 2020, however the restrictions of school access and the ongoing infectious nature of our lives forced us to put it on hold. The core COVID-19 safety measures are still in place and we can now open up classrooms again for parents/carers to engage in their child/ren's learning. These open classroom sessions, along with the termly Parent/Carer Learning Support Document, provides some guidance for those vital home conversations about school, in particular what is happening in the classroom each day.

Ride2School Day

After the second Dr. Cranky Bike Hospital session today, we hope lots of families are geared up for Ride2School Day on *Friday 24 March*. As we launch into the Safer Routes to School initiative with Darebin Council, this day has a focus on the benefits of 'active travel' options when coming to and going from school. Queries and Concerns

Now that parents and carers have spent some time with their child/ren's 2023 teachers, it is important we outline the steps when queries or concerns arise. Here are the general steps within our school structure for such times:

- For child-centred matters, the first point of contact should always be the grade teacher/s as they are the best person to either deal with the matter, or 'triage' to the best staff member who can help you further.
- When an issue is complicated, or the initial meeting does not end in a mutually agreed resolution, the team leader or a member of the Leadership Team could get involved, this being Emma Heywood, Xenia Matani, Gab Goss or David Twite. Parents should not go directly to a senior member of staff, eg: Wellbeing Leader, unless it is an ongoing matter.
- For general queries about whole school initiatives or operational matters, contact either Emma or me directly.
- For queries about parent payments, events, Compass and medications, please contact the office staff.

Regardless of the situation, it is always important for us to keep an open mind and remember there are often varying perspectives to any given issue. If we approach every query or concern with the child's best interest at heart, we can usually work together to reach a positive outcome for all.




