


# From our Principal:

#### Ride2School Day

It was wonderful to see so many active travellers arrive at school today. Along with Dr Cranky's Bike Hospital sessions, Ride2School day launches the engagement element of the Safe Routes to School Program. Ongoing collaboration with Darebin Council will allow us to develop impactful actions in the four key areas of Education, Engagement, Engineering and Enforcement. Our Safe Routes Leader Josh Grogan will publish more of the actions soon.

As an active bike riding community, it is important that the rules for riding are at the front of mind for everyone who rides. Attached is a resource from Legal Aid Victoria providing guidance about bicycle road rules in Victoria.



This coming Monday, our Maths Specialists Paul Nicholson and Jack Fray, have organised a fabulous time after school with a focus on Numeracy. We are hoping families can allocate time between 4.00pm -6.00pm to join in the Maths Madness with games, puzzles and Maths stories aimed at giving parents and carers a taste of 21st century learning in this core



subject. Your children can also showcase some of the Maths activities they do at school which can generate rich conversation at home, not just on Monday night, but at any time in the future. All teachers on duty that day will attend for the first part, with a proportion of staff extending beyond their hours of attendance to support this special event until pack up at 6.00pm.

#### **Industrial Agreement Between AEU and Department of Education**

The 2022 Agreement has now been part of the state education system for over six months and the adjustments that need to be made in certain areas will become more obvious over time. Whilst we will always endeavour to continue providing extra-curricular opportunities for the students and other special events for the whole community, a new aspect around Time in Lieu (TiL) has become a significant factor in our planning.

The Family Maths Night is one example where we have had to make some subtle adjustments to who attends for the entire time, as well as starting the event slightly earlier. Any time staff are required to attend school-organised activities after their set hours of attendance, I must engage with them in the Time in Lieu process. This means acquitting the extra hours in one of three ways that all have an impact on resources (time and/or money). We have an agreed plan and will make things work, however not all staff will be involved on Monday afternoon for the entire event as I need to manage the impact of TiL. Staff at this school are always highly committed to putting in the extra time and effort supporting these special events and other experiences such as camps, but in these current conditions, decisions have to be made to manage TiL throughout the year.

5B!!


A big CONGRATULATIONS to 5B.

# What's happening in Music?

#### PREP

We are learning how to do actions to the beat while singing the song 'One, Two, Three'. We are also learning about pitch and playing high and low notes and we are loving hearing music from all around the world!

#### GRADES 1 and 2

We are learning how to sing and play instruments to an African song from Ghana in called 'Kye Kye Kule'. There is a lot of call and response in this song and we have to listen to the song carefully to make sure we keep to the beat.

# GRADES 3 and 4

We have been learning how to read drum notation and play rhythms on our bucket drums. We have notated our own bucket drumming rhythms and will perform them in small groups.

#### **GRADE 1 CELEBRATION OF LEARNING**


It was wonderful to welcome back parents into our classrooms to help the Grade 1 students celebrate the amazing work they have been doing with their recount writing.

Throughout the term, students have been focusing on writing a personal recount. They were exposed to the format of what needs to be included in a recount such as 'when, where, who, what and why'. They showed an understanding that a personal recount is writing about something that has happened in the past. All students worked through the process of creating a plan, draft and finally a published piece of writing.

The Grade 1 teachers were thrilled with the students' perseverance and effort in completing their stories.



# Full boarding homestay families are sought for International Students at Northcote High School



(For new International Students arriving in July 2023)

We are very excited to be welcoming International Students back to Victoria post the onset of the COVID Pandemic.

Northcote High School seeks quality homestays from our local community, to help care for new international student arrivals (Year 10-11 age group) in July 2023. Our international students are mainly from Asian countries, such as China, Vietnam, Korea, Japan and Thailand and they will continue to complete their VCE studies with us in the following years.

Hosting International Students can bring a rich cross cultural experience and opportunity for families. Many local families already on board with the Northcote High School Homestay Program over the years have enjoyed and benefited from the diverse cultural and language exchange experience, especially when they have school age children at home. The reverse experience for our International Students is very much part of their overseas study journey.

Full boarding homestay fees are \$340 per week (tax free), which covers a fully furnished room, three healthy meals daily, laundry, household bills (including internet). Students are encouraged to participate in the normal household family chores and responsible for their own transport.


