From our Principal:

End of Term Reflection

I would like to acknowledge the overall positive start to the year with less disruptions compared to recent years. This enabled us to consolidate those important learning routines plus schedule some special events such as the *Celebrations of Learning* and the *Maths Family Fun Night*. Other initiatives to re-engage our community included the *Dr. Cranky's Bike Hospital* and the *Ride2School Day* plus the re-branding of the Community Engagement and FUNdraising group with year level parent/carer representatives for every grade.

A special thanks to CEF leaders Vanessa, Ceinwen and Vaia from School Council, who pulled together the *Icy Pole Day* and the *Easter Guess Competition* together in a short time. It has kick started this year's events in great fashion.

The launch of our Social and Emotional Learning (SEL) scope and sequence of lesson for all year levels was an important step in the wellbeing space. This initiative aims to map out the key themes year upon year to support a positive mental health mindset, and provide tools and strategies for those challenging situations at school and beyond. Gym/Hall Capital Works Update

Interface Constructions are virtually at lock up stage for the gym/hall, meaning the wetter weather will have minimal impact during the finishing stages of the project. They are on schedule for a mid-year completion and School Council are now working on an opening ceremony for later in the year. Term 2 Start

With an unusual start to Term 2, outlined below are the main things happening in the first two weeks:

- The school is open for learning on *Monday 24 April*, with the ANZAC Day public holiday on *Tuesday 25 April*.

- House meetings are scheduled for the morning of *Thursday 27 April* to make some cross age connections, brief the students on up-coming events and introduce the House Captains for 2023. No need for parents to attend.
- On *Friday 28 April*, the House Cross Country will be run for all Grade 4-6s down at AH Capp Reserve, where house colours are expected and lots of encouragement required for everyone to have a go.
- On *Friday 5 May* we will hold the House Tabloid Activities event on the South Oval with splashes of house colours everywhere. Parents/carers are welcome to attend but space might be tight.


Inquiry Unit: What Makes Australia Unique?

What better way to begin our Inquiry unit than learning about 'What makes Australia unique?'





RESPECTFUL STATE OF THE POPULATION OF THE POPULA

On the Curriculum Day, Tuesday 14 March, staff had time to explore Bell Primary's Personal and Social Scope and Sequence which incorporates the Social and Emotional Learning Curriculum, Berry Street Educational Model (BSEM) and Resilience, Rights and Respectful Relationships (RRRR).

Respectful Relationships education is a core component of the Victorian Curriculum from foundation to year 12. It is all about embedding a culture of respect and equality across the entire school community. They cover eight topics of Social and Emotional Learning (SEL) across all levels of primary and secondary education.

In Term 1 we covered **Topic 1: Emotional Literacy** and **Topic 2: Personal Strengths**.

Topic 1: Emotional Literacy

Emotional literacy can be defined as the ability to understand ourselves and other people. It includes the ability to understand, express and manage our own emotions, build empathy, and respond appropriately to the emotions of others. Building a large vocabulary for emotions helps to increase emotional literacy and build self-awareness and empathy with others.

Topic 2: Personal Strengths

Children and young people need a vocabulary to help them recognise and understand strengths and positive qualities in themselves and others. This topic provides learning activities to build this vocabulary and to use it when discussing personal, social, and ethical challenges.

We encourage parents/ carers to talk to your child/ren about what they have learned this term in their Wellbeing lessons.

In Term 2, we will be covering **Topic 3: Positive Coping** and **Topic 4: Problem Solving.**

Ongoing discussions and questions related to topics 3 and 4 will help build their understanding. Please use the Term 2 Parent/ Carer Learning Support Document to find out how you can support your child/ren at home with regular Wellbeing lessons. This information will be sent out by teams early next term along with the main foci in Literacy, Numeracy and Inquiry.
