Gym/Hall News

As flagged in a separate Newsfeed late yesterday, the head contractor, Interface Constructions, has gone into voluntary administration which means the building completion date is likely to be delayed. I have no other details at the moment and will continue to inform the school community as more details come to light. The message to the children is a simple one: 'the gym/hall will be completed but it might take longer than we had hoped.'

We are very fortunate to have two experienced parent reps on this capital works Project Control Group (PCG). Both Meaghan Block and Nick Carrington are well versed in the intricacies of the building industry and this will be of great assistance as we work though the challenges with the VSBA and existing architects, Atelier-Wagner.

The newsfeed last night has the VSBA contact details for anyone who requires more information.

Tabloid Activities

The weather held out for us and we were able to run the House Tabloid Activities today. The sea of Blue, Green, Pink and Yellow was wonderful, and encouragement within each group is building that 'House Spirit'. With the Tabloid activities being a P-6 multi-age event, the opportunity to connect with other children across the school is a key aim of re-introducing the House system at Bell. There was a balance of activities for house points plus activities to promote team building that did not have house points. Let the fun and games continue!















Road Safety Issue Near Bell PS

Dave Hall is leading an important campaign that focuses on the government taking action to ensure the safety of all locals, but particularly those who use that bridge daily such as students travelling to Coburg High School.

The other mission from our ever-active Bell community is the proposed Miller Street pedestrian lights. My understanding is that this vital piece of infrastructure is on the priority list at Darebin Council but not quite over the line for funding yet. It is one of four identified safe routes to school for us but we will need to do more in terms of advocacy to progress this work. Watch out for more details soon about this safety matter on our southern doorstep.

School Uniforms

A reminder that the Bell school uniform is an important part of the school identity and helps build pride and a sense of belonging. We have noticed more children wearing incorrect colours and appearing more casual with their clothes, in particular with jumpers and hoodies. I ask all families to do their best to wear the Bell colours (navy blue and white) as much as possible. The Bell logo is preferred but not essential on every item but the correct colours are important.

If you are looking for some inspiration, here are some ideas for fun things (you can do with the kids) to donate for sale:


- Pot some cuttings or seedlings

With the budget announcement due soon, we have a window of opportunity to finally get the attention of the Roads Minister on this urgent issue. Here is what you can do to help:

1. **Complete** the new VicRoads survey about the Bell Street Bridge via the link below (note there is a glaring error suggesting alternate bridges are only 300/400 m away. From the East side where most foot traffic comes from, these bridges are more than double that distance. This highlights the lack of awareness we are dealing with here!)
