From the Principal:

School Council will be working with Bridget from FUNdraising to look at ideas from the fundraising survey we conducted in late 2019 to see what the next priority project could be. A reminder that since that survey was conducted, the school has committed funds towards:

- TV screens in all classrooms;
- New classroom furniture for grades in the portables;
- · Additional sports equipment in all grades for break time borrowing;
- Top up funds towards the soon to be developed Kids Hub (the old shelter shed).

NAPLAN

The Grade 3 and 5 students are well on the way to completing NAPLAN assessments and should be congratulated for putting in their best efforts, especially embracing the on-line elements of the testing regime. These national tests are one aspect of a purposeful assessment schedule that the school implements throughout the year. The results which will be available early Term 3, provide us with a snapshot of each child's progress in the core learning areas of English and Maths, however they should not be taken in isolation. At a school level, the aggregated data is used to track certain aspects of our school performance and assist us to identify areas for targeted improvement overtime.

Assemblies and QR Code Tracking

From this Monday, we are able to have parents/carers attend the weekly assemblies on the Astroturf near the south oval. Those adults attending <u>MUST</u> register with a Bell PS QR code, as they would be staying on site for more than 15 minutes. There will be QR signs at the gates and on the portable classroom walls near the assembly. We will also have students moving through the audience to help if you missed the posters on the way in.

I urge everyone to adhere to these DET instructions using the State Government QR code system to enable us to continue opening up the school to more of the usual parent/carer events in the near future.

2022 Enrolments (existing or new families) – due by Friday 25 June 2021:

Firstly, thank you to the Bell families who have recently completed an enrolment form and dropped it back to the office. Other families who have a child most likely to commence school in 2022, please complete a Student Enrolment Form as soon as possible. Forms are available on our website or from the office. <u>The timeline to submit forms for existing and new families is the end of June</u>. Getting all existing families enrolled as early as possible helps us manage the additional spaces we can offer new families requesting to attend our school next year.

Tutoring in 2021

Maria Tevelis and Elyssa Agnoletti, our Intervention/Tutoring staff for this year, have been providing additional targeted teaching to the early rounds of identified students in need of extra assistance in Reading or Mathematics since early Term1.

Intervention/tutoring staff, alongside teachers and year level teams, will continue working together to identify additional students in need of tutoring support. These judgements will be based on multiple sources of evidence including Victorian Curriculum achievement levels and classroom-based assessments which are on-going throughout the year. Parent/carer discussion with teachers, whilst important in building the home-school learning partnership, do not guarantee your child the formal tutoring with Maria or Elyssa, as staff must continue prioritising the 1 to 1 or small group interventions to those with the highest academic needs. Individual Educational Plans (IEPs) and differentiated teaching within the classroom are other strategies for students who need additional support.

Throughout the year, all students regardless of their achievement level, will continue to receive high quality classroom instruction though their classroom teacher who will teach to each student's point of need, that is key to differentiation and ensuring learning growth and success for every student.

Within the constraints of the additional funding, not all students achieving below the expected level in a learning area will receive additional support with an intervention/tutoring teacher. Data and evidence will continue to be monitored in an ongoing manner as students' progress throughout the year and appropriate adjustments to the program will be made.

For more information, please contact Maria Tevelis (Tutoring Leader) or Lisa McLeish (Teaching and Learning Leader). Whilst Xenia Matani plays an important role as our Wellbeing Leader, it is not her direct role to initiate any academic support for students in need.

Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund Applications

The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities. If you have a valid means-tested concession card, such as a *Veterans Affairs Gold Card*, *Centrelink Health Care Card* or *Pensioner Concession Card*, or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible. There is also a special consideration category for asylum seeker and refugee families.

The payment amount this year is \$125 for eligible primary school students. Payments are made direct to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions and sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

If you applied for CSEF through our school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year, unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

If you would like to apply for the first time, please contact the school office on 9480 5622 to request an application form. You can also download the form, and find out more about the program and eligibility, on the Department of Education and Training's Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund web page. Please return completed forms to the school office as soon as possible. *CSEF Applications close for 2021 on Monday 21 June.*


Missed Calls

Bell Primary School is committed to the safety and wellbeing of all children and young people. This will be the primary focus of our care and decision-making.


Bell Primary School has zero tolerance for child abuse.
