Safety Around the School

It has been wonderful to see the response to the Walk or Wheels (WOW) initiative with extra families using the footpaths for active travel. However, everyone must remember the following core safety practices:

- Scooter and bike riders must slow down as they get close to the school as the amount of foot traffic increases significantly, making it a tight squeeze along the narrow footpaths near our operational gates.
- Everyone must take those extra steps to use the relevant supervised crossings at Gilbert Road, Oakover Road or Scotia Street every day, and not take short cuts across the busy streets at pick up and drop off times.
- Always use the basic traffic principles of **Stop, Listen and Look** all ways prior to crossing and never pop out from in between parked cars. Little people can't be seen from a driver's perspective.

One of our ex-parents witnessed some near misses recently on the streets around the school with families rushing across the roads to get to school before the 9.00am bell. It's better to be a minute or two late than be in an accident. I realise the lack of operational gates at the front of the school and the south end is causing grief and I am working with the VSBA to get the main gate re-opened as soon as possible.

Safety must always be our highest priority; as the adults, we are the most powerful role models the children have.

Celebrations of Learning on Repeat

Year level teams are organising the Term 2 celebrations of classroom learning with a focus on either Literacy, Numeracy or Inquiry. After such a successful Term 1 celebration, we hope to see many parents and carers once again as every year level will showcase a different learning area from the previous celebration. Look out for a Compass Newsfeed from your child/ren's team leaders before the end of term.

We have also instigated a roster system for the showcasing of classroom happenings in this Newsletter, which will be followed up with children from that grade presenting at assembly in the weeks after publication.

From the Grade 6 Team:

Camp Jungai Report by Margot (News Leader)

On Monday 22nd of May the 6th graders went to Camp Jungai for 4 days and 3 nights.

On the first night, the students all pitched tents and cooked their own food using camp stoves. The next day, after a frosty start, the activities began. Some of the highlights were:

- 1. Talking with and learning from Aunty. The grade 6s got to learn about Aboriginal cultures including bush medicine, how to throw boomerangs, and Aunty's own Dreaming stories, as well as a Gurnai version of Tiddalick, the frog who drank too much water and all the animals had to make him laugh to get back the water.
- 2. The Possum Pull. 10 people would use a pulley and rope to pull a person up to about 15 metres into the air and then the person would aim to throw some soft toys down and into a bucket. After throwing both toys they would get lowered to the ground.
- 3. Canoeing. The grade 6s got into pairs and went inside a canoe. They raced across the lake and played a game where they tapped the top of your boat

and said which team they were on and you would join their team.

The grade 6s had an amazing time and they all thank Aunty and everyone else at Camp Jungai.
