From our Principal:

Remote and Flexible Learning 3.0

As we roll into what we hope is only one more week of on-line learning, I would firstly like to thank everyone for their support and engagement at a family level to our approach. Building on the model we refined during Term 3 last year, we aim to deliver specific lessons in the areas of Literacy, Numeracy, Inquiry and Wellbeing within DET guidelines and timeframes that is a balanced approach. There are certain times throughout the week we envisage students to be on-line and other times when they can work through Google Classroom lessons at their own pace and at times that work for the family. Key benefits of this balanced approach include:

- The morning meeting runs for a full 30 minutes to set the scene for the day, connect children with each other, for the teacher to unpack the day's lessons and work through any questions;
- There will also be specific introduction/mini lesson at the back end of the 30 minute meeting about the main Literacy or Numeracy lesson with some explicit modelling and/or examples of work that will support the Google Classroom activity and recordings within the lesson;
- The group conferences have evolved into mini lessons with a targeted approach for each group that enables the teacher to differentiate the content for that group's particular point of need. The group structure enables direct feedback and collaboration with teacher/student interactions;
- The other group session has more of a wellbeing and student connections focus as we see enormous value in the social learning and collaborative approach;
- Two priority tasks (one Literacy and one Numeracy) will be added to the timetable for next week and personalised feedback will be provided to each student who submits that work. Other work submitted will be acknowledged in simple but engaging ways;
- The Google Classroom approach gives a strong element of flexibility for families which was a key piece of feedback last year.

We recognise families have different ways of tackling home learning and if there are any specific concerns related to your child, do not hesitate to contact their teacher. Conversely, they may reach out to certain families to see what extra supports can be put in place if the child is struggling to engage. This is by no means a reflection of parent/carer efforts, rather a call to see how we can work together in these uncertain times.

Remember- 'Everyone simply does their best and tries not to stress'.

Compass Newsfeeds and Website

The PowerPoint presentation sent home at the start of remote and flexible learning has been set as a priority on the Compass newsfeed for parents/carers to easily access. It will also appear in the Curriculum section of the website. Any adjustments to our approach will be updated in both places to reduce the communications. We will aim to only send short newsfeeds to highlight any adjustments and refer to the main PowerPoint for details.

Classroom Cuisine Lunch Orders



A reminder to always pack some extra snacks for your child/ren if you have ordered a Classroom Cuisine lunch. More often than not, the delivery arrives in time for the 11.30am eating time, but as Fridays are the busiest day for lunch orders Melbourne-wide, delivery can sometimes be much later. This is where the snacks come in handy! The next eating time is not until 2.00pm.



Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund Applications

The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities. If you have a valid means-tested concession card, such as a *Veterans Affairs Gold Card*, *Centrelink Health Care Card* or *Pensioner Concession Card*, or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible. There is also a special consideration category for asylum seeker and refugee families.

The payment amount this year is **\$125** for eligible primary school students. Payments are made direct to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions and sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

If you applied for CSEF through our school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year, unless there has been a change in your family circumstances. If you would like to apply for the first time, please contact the school office on 9480 5622 to request an application form. You can also download the form, and find out more about the program and eligibility, on the Department of Education and Training's Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund web page. Please return completed forms to the school office as soon as possible. *CSEF Applications close for 2021 on Monday 21 June.*

Messages to remind students to attend OSH Club are unnecessary as OSH Club staff always make 'reminder' announcements for students who are booked in but have not yet shown up.

If you are arriving late or leaving early, the <u>ONLY</u> thing we need **you** to do is either sign in LATE <u>at the office</u> (WITH YOUR CHILD), or sign out EARLY <u>at the office</u> **before** collecting your child.

PLEASE DO NOT call the school if you have received a 'missed call' notification. Bell PS Staff are advised they must leave a message where possible which may take a minute or two to arrive on your phone, so please wait to check. Many messages are just a 'courtesy' call and do not require a reply.






Sort by

In this session we got to paint boomerangs, using symbols from one of the local Aboriginal languages, to create a story. The stories people came up with were truly fascinating. While they were drying, we went outside to throw boomerangs! Only a few managed to either make it come back, or throw it into the soccer goals. Those who did, Aunty said they got bragging rights.

These sessions topped off Camp Jungai and made it one of the best camps our year has ever been on.
