From our Assistant Principal:

As outlined in David's Compass Newsfeed to the community, an unknown person in a red car, possibly a Honda or Commodore, approached a Bell student on their way home from school on Wednesday afternoon on Miller Street. A second group of students reported seeing a person in a red car observing and possibly taking photos near Swaine Reserve (the train park) and a third group of students saw a man in a similar red car appear to be approaching them near the local IGA.

All students are safe, and we want to reassure the school community that, while these encounters are obviously of great concern, the police have all the information and will be undertaking the appropriate investigations and increasing patrols in the area.

We thank the parents/carers who contacted the school on Wednesday so communication could be disseminated to the whole community. In these instances, a phone call to the school is the most direct method of communication that can be actioned immediately. When incidents of a concerning nature occur with students on their way to or from school, contacting both the police and school is a priority. This enables the authorities to act immediately and the school to seek support from the Department, who will also inform other local schools so it can be communicated with their families.

Teachers will continue to discuss with students the ways to keep themselves safe when travelling to and from school, as well as protective actions should they feel unsafe or uncomfortable. We would appreciate the support of parents/carers to continue these conversations at home.

Last Assembly for Term 2

Our end of term Assembly will be held on the last day – *Friday 23 June* at *1:45pm*. Highlights will include performances from our Senior Vocal Ensemble and Rock Band. All parents/carers are invited to attend and celebrate the final day of Term 2 for 2023. *Students will be dismissed at 2:30pm*.

Assembly Trial Term 3

Next term, we will be trialling a change to our weekly assembly which will take place on a Friday at 3pm to end the week. This enables classroom teachers to maximise Monday mornings as optimal learning time and settle into the routines for the week. We hope that it will also enable an increased number of parents/carers to attend regularly. Feedback will be sought from the community (students, teachers and parents/carers) post-trial, to inform a more substantive decision moving forward.

These meetings facilitate individual time for teachers and parents/carers to discuss their child's progress so far this year and are an important opportunity for you to:

- talk more in-depth about your child's student report, their achievements and areas for future learning
- help your child's teacher(s) understand more about your child
- exchange information to support your child's learning, social and emotional needs
- make plans with the teacher(s) about how you can both support your child
- continue to strengthen the crucial home-school partnership

A reminder that interviews with Specialist teachers are optional and only occur on the date stated above.

When collecting your child early or dropping them off late, the Compass kiosk in the front office must **always** be your first stop to sign your child in/out before heading to the classroom. The correct slip (green for early departure, orange for late arrival) needs to be given to your child's teacher, indicating they have been signed in/out. Without entering your child at the Compass kiosk, their attendance and whereabouts will not be amended. Thank-you for your cooperation with this important process.


