From our Principal:

All proceeds are going towards the additional high end audio-visual equipment required to make our gym/hall a truly multi-purpose venue where we can hold our own concerts, graduations and other exciting community events.

Access via Oakover Road Gate

With an uncertain restart date for the building works, we have reviewed access options into the school and will reopen the Oakover Road gate for families to access the school from the south. We are working with the VSBA to create a safe and accessible passage from the south oval. Whilst the pathway into the centre of the school is currently not ideal, some families might choose to wind their way through the temporary fence channel onto the basketball/netball court for quicker access to the main building or Leaning Centre. This will reduce the traffic pressure on the busy Scotia Street footpaths, especially with many bikes and scooters being used as active transport options.

We are hoping to rearrange the temporary fences so a small area of the bike racks will be re-opened to also ease the pressure at the north end.

I ask those using the south gate to stay on the concrete path to reduce the wear and tear on the south oval.

Assembly Today and Next Term

Today's Assembly will be outside if weather permits, however if the showers persist we will make a call at 11.30 am to shift it into the Learning Centre in a modified format. This would mean most grades would view the Assembly from their rooms via an internal stream with the Senior Vocal Ensemble, the VSSS Dance Squad and our Rock Band performing in the confined space with a few grades.

With limited space, only parents/carers of those performing and presenting would be able to attend in the Learning Centre. This is not ideal but necessary whilst we are still at the mercy of the weather for outdoor community events. We are all looking forward to the day when the gym/hall gives us total control and much flexibility. **Students will be dismissed at 2:30pm regardless of the assembly format.**

Next term, we will be trialling a change to our weekly Assembly which will take place on a *Friday at 3.00pm* to maximise Monday mornings as optimal learning time. We hope that it increases the number of parents/carers that attend. Feedback will be sought from the community (students, teachers and parents/carers) post-trial.

Celebrations of Learning

Thank you to the waves of parents and carers who have taken time to pop into their child/ren's classrooms this week to engage in the various celebrations of learning. With a range of foci from Literacy, Numeracy and Inquiry units of work, we hope these visits stimulate some in-depth discussions and further positive celebrations at home. It is clear that those meaningful conversations about learning at school have a significant impact on the children in terms of motivation, confidence and persistence to do their best every day to achieve their next level of success.

Semester Two Swimming Program

The expanded swimming program re-commences next term for Grades 1-5 students at Elite Swimming in Pascoe Vale, the same venue as last year. The six lessons in blocks of two per week for three weeks are scheduled for early Term 3. The Preps will have the more traditional one lesson per week for the first half of the term, allowing them more time between lessons as we think that is a better way to introduce them to the school swimming program.

I urge families to engage in the swimming program that the Department and Bell PS are committed to delivering for all students regardless of prior swimming experience. Afterall, we do live on an island surrounded by water around this beautiful country.

I wish everyone a safe and relaxing mid-year break and look forward to seeing everybody in early August upon my return from my central Australian adventure.

DON'T FORGET THE SLIP!

EARLY

When collecting your child early or dropping them off late, the Compass kiosk in the front office *must* always be your first stop to sign your child in/out before heading to the classroom. The correct slip (green for early departure, orange for late arrival) needs to be given to your child's teacher, indicating they have been signed in/out. Without entering your child at the Compass kiosk, their attendance and whereabouts will not be amended. Thank-you for your cooperation with this important process.

LATE ARRIVALS, EARLY DEPARTURES OR STUDENT ABSENCES

- 1. Late Arrival: ONLY enter this on the Compass Kiosk at the office on arrival.
- 2. **Early Departure**: **ONLY** enter this on the Compass Kiosk at the office on arrival.
- 3. Whole Day Absence: MUST be entered on your Compass Parent Portal either in advance, or on the day by clicking the absence SMS link.

Please help the Admin Team out by NOT entering medical/dental appointments, etc, through your Compass Parent Portal – simply follow the early departure / late arrival procedure when you come in to drop off or collect your child.

COVID Reminder

A reminder to Bell families to please continue to report your child's positive test result directly to the front office via phone or email. While the isolation guidelines have recently changed, we kindly ask that we are still informed of positive cases to keep track of absences and let your child's teacher know.

Rapid Antigen Tests are still available from the front office.


