From our Acting Principal:

Welcome back for Term 3. How fast the year is going! Despite the cooler weather, we hope families have had a safe and relaxing break. Alongside daily learning, it is going to be another action-packed term with events such as Prep-Grade 5 swimming, Grade 4-6 Athletics Carnival, Grade 5 Camp and other year level-based excursions and incursions scheduled to take place. As mentioned in communications at the end of last term, David is on leave for the first part of this term. We wish David and Jeanette a well-deserved break in central Australia and look forward to his return in early August.

Assembly

A reminder that our weekly assembly will now take place on a *Friday* at *3.00pm*, beginning today. This trial of a new day and time seeks to maximise Monday mornings as optimal learning time, and enable an increased number of parents/carers to attend. Feedback will be sought from all members of the community regarding the change of day and time later in the term.

First Aid Room

Despite the current hold on the gym/hall construction, the VSBA have approved the final elements of our new First Aid Room which were completed over the holidays. Having a dedicated First Aid Room in the main building will enable students who are unwell to receive treatment in a quieter, more private space.

School Access

This week, access to the school via the Oakover Road pedestrian gate has been reinstated meaning families are now able to access the school from the south. Temporary fences have been adjusted to widen the path and enable access to the outside bike racks. Re-opening this gate should ease some congestion at the northern end of the school and on Scotia Street footpaths while the front of the school remains closed.

During our assembly, we will be reminding students who ride/scoot to school of appropriate etiquette on a shared path, including:

- Walking bikes/scooters in areas of congestion
- Giving way to pedestrians on the footpath
- Keeping to the left and using single file
- Using a warning device, such as a bell or their voice, when overtaking.

If your child rides or scoots to school, we would appreciate parents/carers engaging in a similar conversation at home. This will help to ensure all members of our school and broader community feel safe around our school at the beginning and end of the school day.

We would like to remind parents/carers that bikes and scooters cannot be ridden in the school ground before school after 8:45am, and after school before 3:45pm.

Semester Reports & Parent/Carer-Teacher Conferences

A reminder that Parent/Carer-Teacher Conferences will take place next week. These Conferences facilitate individual time for parents/carers to meet with their child's classroom teacher to discuss their Semester 1 Report and any other matters pertinent to their child. Students are welcome to attend these sessions with their parent/carer to discuss their learning progress and future learning goals.

LATE ARRIVALS, EARLY DEPARTURES OR STUDENT ABSENCES

- 1. Late Arrival: ONLY enter this on the Compass Kiosk at the office on arrival.
- 2. Early Departure: ONLY enter this on the Compass Kiosk at the office on arrival.
- 3. **Whole Day Absence**: **MUST** be entered on your Compass Parent Portal either in advance, or on the day by clicking the absence SMS link.

Please help the Admin Team out by NOT entering medical/dental appointments, etc, through your Compass Parent Portal – simply follow the early departure / late arrival procedure when you come in to drop off or collect your child.

COVID Requirements Update

As of July 10, Victorian schools are no longer required to keep records of student COVID cases, however the DET recommendation remains in place that any staff or students who test positive for COVID should stay home for 5 days minimum and only return to school when they are symptom-free. We kindly ask that you continue to inform office staff or your child's teacher if your child tests positive for COVID. Free rapid antigen tests are still available at the front office. Thank you for your continued co-operation.

Hello parents and carers,


NAIDOC week took place during the school holidays. It is a weeklong celebration of Indigenous culture and learning.

On the 13th of July, the grade sixes re-engaged in NAIDOC week. They learned about Aboriginal culture and dived into the way Aboriginal groups think, see and feel about Country. They watched inspirational videos and learned about the concept of *dadirri*, a way of deep listening and quiet stillness as a way of thinking. They also had fun making hands with aboriginal markings on them with our prep buddies. It looked really cool.

Grade One students have produced some beautiful artworks of Australian animals

In Grade Four, students have learned the game 'buroinjin'. This was a ball game played by the Kabi Kabi people of South Queensland. The game was played with a ball made of kangaroo skin, which was called a buroinjin. The ball, which was smaller than a soccer ball, was sewn with tendons and stuffed with grass. Teams from different groups played against each other. The game was often played until sunset. Spectators used to mark their applause by calling out 'Ei, ei'.
