From our Principal:

Current On-Site COVID Restrictions

Whilst the return to face to face learning has been welcome by all, there are still restrictions in place until the State Government and DET review them in the weeks to come. There are a number of significant adjustments to school operations to help reduce the risk of COVID -19 spreading.

The staggered start and finish times to help reduce mixing across the school community with:

- Families with surnames A–K drop students off between 8:50 9:00am
- Families with surnames L-Z drop students off between 9:00 9:10am
- The **9:15am** bell signals the beginning of whole class learning time.
- Students that arrive *after this time* will need to be <u>signed in by a parent/carer at the front office</u>.
- Families with surnames A-K collect children between 3:20-3:30pm
- Families with surnames L-Z collect children between 3:30-3:40pm

Visitors to the school (including parents and carers) should be kept to a minimum. If you do need to enter a building, please remember to check in using the QR code provided, wear a mask and maintain 1.5m distance.

Where possible, staff are operating in workforce bubbles to minimise mixing in case of future outbreaks and anyone becoming a close contact. This will not affect the daily teaching programs and support for learning by our integration aides. The high level of collaborative team planning will still continue.

Students will predominately work within their classrooms with grade level mixing kept to a minimum unless outside.

Some extra-curricular activities including lunchtime clubs, Boîte choir and the instrumental music programs during school hours have been put on hold for the time being. However, some out of school hours activities such as Kelly Sports, Funky Glee and French Club are able to continue under current guidelines, with specific requirements.

No large gatherings such as school assemblies for now.

Camps and excursions are able to continue at this point in time and we are currently trying to reschedule events such as the Grade 4-6 Aths Carnival, Swimming for the Grade 4s, 3s and 1s and the Winter Sports Gala Day for Grade 6s. Planning for the Grade 5 camp to Waratah Bay is continuing and detailed information will be sent home shortly to those families

We recognise the added stresses that home learning creates and staff appreciate everyone's efforts to make the best of a challenging situation. Fingers crossed we can have a smooth run of regular school life and that current restrictions across the state will continue to ease over the coming weeks.

Athletics Carnivals

We have re-scheduled the Grade 4-6 Aths Carnival for <u>Monday 16 August</u> at Coburg Athletics Track as we are allowed to re-commence sporting activities. The aim is to have a sports day where every child participates in the range of events Josh has organised as part of the PE program and also assist us to selected a squad to compete in the District event later in the week.

As the timeline is very tight now, parents of the students selected on the Monday will receive a Compass Event Consent notification for the Districts Athletics as soon as practical after Monday's trials. We ask those parents/carers to (1) provide online Event Consent via Compass and (2) pay via Qkr! by Wednesday 18 August, as the <u>District Athletics is scheduled for Thursday 19 August</u>. At this point in time parents and carers are not allowed to attend, however if the restrictions ease before the day, we will certainly welcome everyone.

We will also organise a mini-aths event at school for the Prep to Grade 3s in the near future as we have done in previous years (except for 2020) so the younger students can get a taste of these types of sports activities. There will also be some novelty activities to make it a fun filled time for all. An exact date will be published soon and we hope it will be at time when parents and carers can attend and enjoy the time with the children and staff.


