# From our Acting Principal:

#### **NAPLAN for Grade 3 and 5**

By now, parents/carers of Grade 3 and 5 students will have received their child's individual NAPLAN results via mail. Each report has an explanation of how to read the results and a summary of skills assessed that will assist parents/carers to understand how their child performed against national standards.

NAPLAN continues to measure and show student achievement in the assessed areas of numeracy, reading, writing, spelling, and grammar and punctuation. However, in a change to the reporting style nationally, results for each area are now classified into one of four proficiency levels: Exceeding, Strong, Developing and Needs additional support.

While there are some benefits to this change in reporting, including more parent/carer friendly language and more meaningful information provided through the skills summary, at a school level the change to how NAPLAN is reported means that 2023 data and onwards is not comparable to previous NAPLAN data. NAPLAN results provide a snapshot of student performance on the day of the test and is one piece of evidence to line up with the range of school-based assessments taken throughout the year. Parents/carers may make a time to discuss the results with the class teacher if they have concerns or questions.

#### **Parent and Carer Opinion Survey**

The families who have been randomly selected to participate in this year's parent/carer survey would have received an email yesterday inviting them to complete the survey.

Whilst optional, we encourage all families identified through the random selection to participate. The survey will be conducted online, takes approximately 20 minutes to complete, and can be accessed at any convenient time within the survey period - *Monday 7 August to Friday 8 September*.

#### **Oakover Road Crossing Supervisor**

We are continuing to express our concerns to the local council regarding the Oakover Road crossing being without a supervisor on a **Wednesday** morning and **Thursday** morning and afternoon. We will try to support families crossing the road with a staff member acting as Crossing Supervisor, however this is not always possible.

In the meantime, if your child/ren cross Oakover Road on the above days, please have a conversation about road safety with them and the importance of taking care whilst crossing roads. The council assure us they are in the process of actively recruiting and training new staff, so we are hoping to have another permanent Crossing Supervisor soon.

#### <u>Swimming</u>

This week students in Grades 1 to 5 concluded their participation in the swimming program for the year. It is amazing to see in the short space of a few weeks the development of organisational and self-management skills, particularly in our younger students, as they grow further in their independence over the course of the program.

Again, we would like to thank Josh for his organisation of the program and for staff in their flexibility and adjustments to regular classroom programs.

- 1. Late Arrival: ONLY enter this on the Compass Kiosk at the office on arrival.
- 2. Early Departure: ONLY enter this on the Compass Kiosk at the office on arrival.
- 3. Whole Day Absence: MUST be entered on your Compass Parent Portal either in advance, or on the day by clicking the absence SMS link.

Please help the Admin Team out by NOT entering medical/dental appointments, etc, through your Compass Parent Portal – simply follow the early departure / late arrival procedure when you come in to drop off or collect your child.

# COVID Requirements Update

As of July 10, Victorian schools are no longer required to keep records of student COVID cases, however the DET recommendation remains in place that any staff or students who test positive for COVID should stay home for 5 days minimum and only return to school when they are symptom-free. We kindly ask that you continue to inform office staff or your child's teacher if your child tests positive for COVID. Free rapid antigen tests are still available at the front office. Thank you for your continued co-operation.


The wise and patient cow explained "You need to learn how to share".
