From our Principal:

Grade 4 Bike Ed and Camp

Grade 4 have been participating in Bike Ed lessons this term, starting with building their skills and knowledge within the school grounds. This week they ventured onto roads close to the school to apply themselves in real situations. Thanks to the two parents (Nic and Zara) who joined the staff to supervise along the route.











Next week they head to Camp where their riding skills and road knowledge will be tested on two longer bike rides, both on bush tracks and into the beautiful township of Marysville. Lots of other Outdoor Ed activities will fill their three days and two nights. We anticipate a strong sense of achievement at the end of their first Bell camping experience. The week following Camp, Bike Ed continues at school with more extensive rides around the local streets to hone their riding skills and safety awareness. Extra helpers are required for the street rides on Tuesday mornings.

Bell RAP

The Reconciliation Action Plan Working Group is building momentum as a process is developed to engage key stakeholders on what a RAP vision looks like for our community. They are liaising with our area Koorie Education Support Officer (KESO) to analyse where our strengths and gaps are in the various areas of the RAP process. Look out for a RAP WhatsApp post and Compass Newsfeed to collect parent/carer thoughts on the vision.

Parking Around the School

Parking at Bell is always a challenge, especially in Scotia Street. Drivers need to be considerate of others when parking and, in particular, the local residents. Please ensure there is enough space between vehicles, so no-one is entirely boxed in. Parking in front of driveways *cannot* occur. The Kiss 'n' Go spots are for a quick turnaround; cars in these spaces *must not* be left unattended. One option is to arrive a few minutes earlier for drop offs and pickups and use the surrounding streets where a short walk is necessary. This will help to ease the pressure in Scotia Street, as safety is always the number one priority for all of the Bell Community.

2026 Students Numbers

I request that any existing families planning to leave Bell for whatever reason by the end of the year, please contact the office as soon as you have definitive plans to help us adjust our predicted numbers for 2026. With a staffing shortage in the system, the sooner we can establish accurate enrolment numbers for next year, the sooner we have a clearer understanding of staffing requirements.



Working With Children Checks

Parents/carers who intend to participate in any volunteering with the school (eg reading, excursion support, etc) **must** hold a current Working With Children Check card. Even if you don't have your name down for any



volunteering on the immediate horizon, we strongly suggest applying for a WWCC as soon as possible- a Volunteer WWCC is free! List Bell Primary on your WWCC application and we will automatically receive a copy in the mail for our records, or you can supply your card to the front office for us to add to our parent/carer register. If you are a current VIT card holder, you can provide to the office in lieu of a WWCC.

NB- if you are volunteering with activities onsite that don't involve working directly with students (eg organising resources, fundraising stall set-up, etc), you must still hold a valid WWCC and supply it to the office.


From the Art Room:


Victorian State School Spectacular Tickets!




