From our Principal:

School Concert Tickets

Tickets for the school production 'The Great Primary School Mystery' will go on sale early next week via a Compass Newsfeed containing ticketing information and a link to purchase the tickets. There will be a **four-tickets-per-family limit**, which means a total of four tickets for one night <u>or</u> a combination over the two nights. Allocated seating means you can book early, allowing for a better selection of seats. If there are families who choose not to use their quota of four, additional tickets may become available closer to the events for other families to purchase.

Absences throughout the Community

We are experiencing a high number of illnesses from staff, students and possibly parents/carers, as we transition from Winter. Staff absences are being managed as best we can with significant challenges in terms of the unavailability of relief teachers on any given day. Splitting grades is something we do on a semi-regular basis; however this is currently required more often. Ultimately, for staff or students, you need to stay at home when you are ill until you are healthy.

SunSmart Time

As we roll into Spring, it is time to find our hats, dust them off and begin wearing them again. Students who do not have their hat and cannot access one of the spare hats in classrooms, will need to find shade in the shelter shed at break times. The school broad brim hats are available via PSW, our contracted uniform supplier.

Biodiversity Garden Development

Work is continuing along the front of the school between the gym and Scotia Street with the Sustainability team of students, staff and parents/carers, developing the plans for an indigenous garden, another aim of providing crucial flora for the endangered blue banded bee. There will be a Bell Blitz Working Bee early next term





to complete the works once Brett Allen, Ivy Callander and Julie Garbutt have finished the main works, with help from various student leaders.

Parent Opinion Survey

The annual Department of Education survey will be available for all families to fill in once it is released via a separate Compass Newsfeed next week. I urge all parents/carers to engage to allow the leadership team and school council to analyse results later in the year. We'll examine what's going well and what needs further improvement from a parent perspective.

P-3 Mini Aths

The Prep-Grade 3 Mini Athletics Carnival has been re-scheduled for the last week of term, Monday 15 September running from 9.15am to 11.30am. It will be held on the South Oval and in the gym. Grade 6 Specialist Leaders have organised a range of modified athletic and novelty activities to give the younger students a taste of a sports carnival. Many of the other Grades 6s will be there to help run the event. House points will be allocated for all participants and extras for those who excel. Parents/carers are most welcome to attend.

It was amazing to see so many families join in the celebration of this special day in our calendar. School Council tried something different this year and it was clearly something that resonated with many from the community, judging by the numbers. We know to cater for even more next year! It was wonderful to see so many parents, carers and some grandparents attend the Book Week Parade on Monday. So much effort resulting in so much engagement and fun for the students. The references to staff dress-ups were greatly appreciated by the teachers and ES who continue to step up.

This has been a hectic term with many excursions, swimming and other special events, including the termly celebrations of learning for every year level and specialists. We do acknowledge a few events were late in terms of communication to families, and we will continue to refine these processes within our operational systems. Bell PS Uniforms

- 1. NEW Bell PS uniforms can always be purchased from PSW.
- SECOND-HAND Uniforms can be purchased from our Second-Hand Uniform Shop (far side of the basketball court) run by two fantastic family volunteers twice per week Wednesday mornings around drop-off time and Friday afternoons from 3:15-3:45. Don't forget your gold coins no credit or credit card facility is available.

Late Arrivals, Early Departures + Authorised Pick-ups

Don't forget to come through the front office <u>before</u> going to the classroom for any late arrivals (after 9am) or early departures (before 3:30pm). Your child must be signed in/out on the Compass Kiosk and the corresponding card should be taken to give to your child's teacher, indicating that you have completed the arrival/departure process.

** CHILDREN ARRIVING LATE MUST BE WALKED TO THEIR CLASSROOM BY A PARENT/CARER **

If your child will be collected early for any reason by someone who is not their legal guardian, the school office must be informed in advance as your child cannot be signed out in these instances without authorisation from a parent/carer.



Working With Children Checks

Parents/carers who intend to participate in any volunteering with the school (eg reading, excursion support, etc) **must** hold a current Working With Children Check card. Even if you don't have your name down for any



volunteering on the immediate horizon, we strongly suggest applying for a WWCC as soon as possible- a Volunteer WWCC is free! List Bell Primary on your WWCC application and we will automatically receive a copy in the mail for our records, or you can supply your card to the front office for us to add to our parent/carer register. If you are a current VIT card holder, you can provide to the office in lieu of a WWCC.

NB- if you are volunteering with activities onsite that don't involve working directly with students (eg organising resources, fundraising stall set-up, etc), you must still hold a valid WWCC and supply it to the office.

<u>PLEASE NOTE</u>: All school volunteers must also have completed the OHS Volunteer Induction process to be able to volunteer.

Lost Library Book Procedure

If your child has lost a school library book, please follow the steps below:

- 1. On the Qkr! app, select Bell Primary School -> Payments -> Lost library book
- 2. Make a payment of \$5 per lost book
- 3. Email a screenshot of your <u>receipt</u> and child's name to <u>bell.ps@education.vic.gov.au</u>
- 4. School staff will then remove the lost/overdue book from your child's library account

Stomp Dance Company Incursions



Fri 3rd Oct - Puzzle Palace **


The final day of the program will challenge children's problem-solving and teamwork skills. They will rotate through puzzle stations, crack secret codes and work together to complete escape-style
