From our Principal:

Continued Wellbeing Focus

Staff have spent time in recent professional learning meetings sharing ideas and researching additional wellbeing lessons from resources such as the Berry Street Educational Model and the Respectful Relationships Curriculum to deliver explicit social and emotional lessons to support the wellbeing conferences. Whilst there is a continued focus on academic subjects including Literacy, Numeracy and Inquiry, targeted teaching on key themes from those two wellbeing resources is even more important as we go further into remote learning and family lockdowns.

Digital Technology Protocols

Overall, teachers have been very impressed with the behaviours and attitudes of students using the online tools for Remote and Flexible Learning, with everyone giving new platforms and links a go to help with daily learning. However, we need to remind parents/carers that as we introduce new web tools and platforms for educational purposes, these can be monitored to a high degree during school time with expectations set by the teachers along the way. Sometimes children are able to move outside the school's G-Suite platform and create their own accounts to use these web tools without teacher monitoring. Whilst the intentions are clear that the children are desperate to connect in any way possible, this is where parents and carers need to regularly monitor their child/ren's online activities at other times.

With eSmart week scheduled across the nation next week, we will expand on this matter and provide some guidance and tips on the types of tools we are using so parents/carers are clear about their purpose during school time. In morning meetings, teachers will revise eSmart practices to remind everyone once more how to be safe and responsible cybercitizens.

Tournament of Minds

A huge congratulations goes to the four teams who competed in the annual tournament last week. The mix of grade 4-6 students worked in teams of seven on a themed challenge with the additional hurdle this year of rehearsing and presenting online. Several teams received outstanding results but, more importantly, all four teams were given such positive feedback on their achievements. From a school perspective, we are so proud of the collaborative and resilient manner they kept on planning and rehearsing to finish the challenge. 

Inventors of 1C:

As part of our Inquiry unit on History, Grade 1 students have been practising the Learning Asset of Researchers and Thinkers to find out about how various things have changed over the years. So far this term, we have looked at changes to and advances in technology, toys, transport, fashion and school life/education.

We have been looking at many different pictures and artefacts of toys and technology from the past, and thinking about how they compare to those we use in the present time.

As part of a writing task during remote learning, students were asked to come up with their own clever technology that has not been created yet that they think would be useful for the future. They drafted, reread, revised and edited their writing, then used their own creative thinking to present their work. Some students chose to finalise their writing with neat handwriting, whilst others chose to present using technology such as a 'pic collage', slide or word documents on a laptop device.




