It was also a day to reflect and celebrate this beautiful boy who will always hold a special place in the hearts of everyone who met him. a special moment afterwards when Reuben's final ride came past the school so we could listen to his favourite song again, *Titanium*, pay our respects and give three cheers as he left the school.

This will assist with any further conversations or questions that might arise with your child/ren after yesterday, or in the near future, as everyone continues to work through Reuben's death in their own way and at their own pace.



Final Curriculum Day + Community Forum

School Council has approved the final pupil free day that I proposed to them which will be scheduled for <u>Monday</u> <u>1 November</u>; the day before Melbourne Cup. The focus for staff will be related to our new strategic plan goal around Literacy and Numeracy (Teaching and Learning). All staff will participate in some foundational work on two key improvement strategies, being our whole school instructional model and the development of our coaching/mentoring approach.

In regard to the new 4-year strategic plan, a Community Forum is planned for <u>Thursday 28 October</u> where we will unpack the plan and discuss other key themes of interest including communication, wellbeing and present the design drawings for the new gym/hall. More information to follow once we know of the restrictions around that time to help us determine whether it's a face to face or on-line session.

Term 4 School Arrangements

As you are all aware, there is no solid information about what the start of next term looks like yet, although there are plenty of rumours floating around. Once the State Government have released their plan which has been promised this Sunday, I will have to wait for DET's detailed information before I can communicate that to the community. Usually, it takes a number of days or even a week or so for DET to work through the logistics from the Chief Health Officer's advice and then we get a updated Operations Guide to follow.

Keep your Compass App open as Emma and I will send out detailed information about the start of Term 4 once we have digested DET's guidelines and made arrangements for what it looks like at Bell PS. I know we are all hoping for a significant easing of restrictions around school settings.

A Safe School Break Ahead

Finally, as we roll into the Term 3 break, I would like to thank everyone in the Bell community (parents/carers, children and staff) for their herculean efforts, kind gestures and sheer determination during the difficult time of another COVID lockdown and the tragedy of Reuben's death. The way we rally together as a community is quite extraordinary and although these times are tough for us all, I know we will get over every life hurdle as we help each other, starting with the kids in our care.




