Over \$1,500 was raised, so thank you to all bakers, sellers and consumers.

As always there were Captains for the event to organise the team and oversee the day, and I would like to acknowledge Clancy Riddiford and Alice McAvoy for their efforts co-ordinating another of our wonderful traditions. We are climbing towards our goal of purchasing lighting equipment for the gym/hall, with every event from the Community Engagement and Fundraising (CEF) Team making a difference.

Referendum Day at Bell

Once again, we have been given the opportunity to be a ballot centre and this is an extremely important voting day for our nation's future. Another member of our CEF team, Bridie Murphy, has volunteered to Captain the fundraising event next Saturday at short notice. I hope we can get plenty of volunteers for the day, with a BBQ and cakes, books and toys stalls being run - please scroll down to pages 6 + 7 for details. I also hope lots of the school and wider community resist the temptation to vote early and pop down to the Learning Centre, cast a vote then buy something from the stalls whilst catching up with others from our connected and inclusive community.

Pupil Free Day

As part of the DoE and AEU Agreement, schools are able to allocate one of their Professional Practice Days as a common day where students do not attend school, enabling teachers to work on key tasks related to their role. After consultation with staff, I have determined that a Pupil Free Day will be held on *Monday 6 November* (the day before Melbourne Cup) where teachers will work on the end of year student assessment and reporting process.

This gives families the opportunity for an extended weekend if work arrangements allow. OSHClub will run a service for the day if enrolments justify a program.

Assembly Survey

During Term 3, we trialled a change of assembly from Monday mornings at 9am, to Friday afternoons at 3pm. We sought feedback from students, staff and parents/carers to help us decide what is best for Bell Primary moving forward. The results will be analysed by our Consultative Committee which will help me make an informed decision about this matter early next week. Assembly will still be Friday afternoons for the time being, with a separate Compass Newsfeed mid next week to inform the community if the change is permanent.

Sustainability and Infrastructure Tree Planting

There was team of amazing workers who planted 90 trees on the first Saturday of the school holidays. The funds were sourced from the Queens Jubilee Grant and the balance will go towards installing an irrigation system utilising the water tanks behind the shelter sheds and old canteen.

- 1. Late Arrival: ONLY enter this on the Compass Kiosk at the office on arrival.
- 2. Early Departure: ONLY enter this on the Compass Kiosk at the office on arrival.
- 3. **Whole Day Absence**: **MUST** be entered on your Compass Parent Portal either in advance, or on the day by clicking the absence SMS link.

Please help the Admin Team out by NOT entering medical/dental appointments, etc, through your Compass Parent Portal – simply follow the early departure / late arrival procedure when you come in to drop off or collect your child.

COVID Requirements Update

As of July 10, Victorian schools are no longer required to keep records of student COVID cases, however the DET recommendation remains in place that any staff or students who test positive for COVID should stay home for 5 days minimum and only return to school when they are symptom-free. We kindly ask that you continue to inform office staff or your child's teacher if your child tests positive for COVID. Free rapid antigen tests are still available at the front office. Thank you for your continued co-operation.


