<u>School Review – Stakeholder Focus Groups</u>

Our School Review is scheduled to commence in Week 4 of this term, with Day 1 focusing on key learning and wellbeing outcomes achieved over the course of our current Strategic Plan.

Day 2 (Fieldwork Day) will involve a series of stakeholder focus groups, led by our reviewer, Leslie Tulloch, and regional representative, Graham Stevenson. These sessions will gather valuable feedback from students, staff, and parents/carers to help shape the future direction of our school.

We invite all parents and carers to participate in an online focus group on Thursday 30 October at 6:00pm (link to be shared closer to the date). Your insights and reflections are an important part of this process, and we encourage as many voices as possible to be part of the conversation.

Pupil Free Day

As previously communicated, the Department of Education and AEU Agreement allow schools to set one common Professional Practice Day for staff. This year, it will be on **Monday 3 November**, which will be a pupil-free day. This provides families with a potential Melbourne Cup long weekend, while giving teachers time for Semester 2 assessment analysis and reporting. Team Kids will offer care on the day if there is enough demand.

Leaving Bell in 2026?

As we continue forward planning for 2026, predicted enrolments are a crucial element to the process. Any families leaving Bell in 2026 are kindly requested to contact the office as soon as they can to assist us with decisions on class structures and next year's staffing profile. We understand there are many reasons why families move on and always appreciate early communication when possible.

Grade Combinations for 2026

Next month, staff will be starting the transition work for next year's grade combinations, with Step Up sessions later in the term. Our starting point for grade allocation is for grade teachers, specialists and leadership to reflect on the dynamics within each grade this year and then seek input from both parents/carers and students.

These steps are done systematically with the parent/carer Google form that will be sent out early next month, and with students having input to their friendship selections as per previous years. *Please do not contact your child's current teacher or anyone in leadership via email or request a meeting yet.* Please wait for the Google form, which will be flagged in forthcoming newsletters, to provide your thoughts about your child/ren's needs for next year.

As I complete my first week as Principal, I want to sincerely thank the entire community for your kind words and support. It's been a privilege to begin this new chapter and continue my journey at a school that has become so special to me over the past six years.

I look forward to working together as we support every student to grow, learn and thrive. Thank you again - I'm excited for what lies ahead.

Bell PS Uniforms

- 1. NEW Bell PS uniforms can always be purchased from PSW.
- 2. <u>SECOND-HAND</u> Uniforms can be purchased from our Second-Hand Uniform Shop (far side of the basketball court) run by two fantastic family volunteers twice per week Wednesday mornings around drop-off time and Friday afternoons from 3:15-3:45. Don't forget your gold coins **no credit or credit card facility is available**.

Late Arrivals, Early Departures + Authorised Pick-ups

Don't forget to come through the front office <u>before</u> going to the classroom for any late arrivals (after 9am) or early departures (before 3:30pm). Your child must be signed in/out on the Compass Kiosk and the corresponding card should be taken to give to your child's teacher, indicating that you have completed the arrival/departure process.

** CHILDREN ARRIVING LATE MUST BE WALKED TO THEIR CLASSROOM BY A PARENT/CARER **

If your child will be collected early for any reason by someone who is not their legal guardian, the school office must be informed in advance as your child cannot be signed out in these instances without authorisation from a parent/carer.



Working With Children Checks

Parents/carers who intend to participate in any volunteering with the school (eg reading, excursion support, etc) **must** hold a current Working With Children Check card. Even if you don't have your name down for any



volunteering on the immediate horizon, we strongly suggest applying for a WWCC as soon as possible- a Volunteer WWCC is free! List Bell Primary on your WWCC application and we will automatically receive a copy in the mail for our records, or you can supply your card to the front office for us to add to our parent/carer register. If you are a current VIT card holder, you can provide to the office in lieu of a WWCC.

NB- if you are volunteering with activities onsite that don't involve working directly with students (eg organising resources, fundraising stall set-up, etc), you must still hold a valid WWCC and supply it to the office.



Dear Bell Families,

We are all excited to be getting close to showcasing our whole-school production 'The Great Primary School Mystery' on Wednesday 15th and Thursday 16th October in the Sports and Performing Arts Hub.

COSTUME INFO FOR STUDENTS:

- LABEL ALL costume items
- Bring your whole costume in a reusable bag WITH YOUR CHILD'S NAME + CLASS CLEARLY MARKED ON THE BAG
- Give your costume bag to your classroom teacher by this **THURSDAY 9th OCTOBER**
- **GRADE 6** costumes bags due by **MONDAY 13**th **OCTOBER,** due to camp.

Why are we bringing our costumes to school before the performances?

• We need to make sure each student has the correct costume ready. Bringing the costumes in early will give us time to troubleshoot.

What happens to the costumes once I bring them in to the classroom teacher?

- Students will be participating in a dress rehearsal on Wednesday 15th October, during the day.
- Students will bring their costume bag home on Wednesday afternoon so that they can get changed into their costume at home, before getting dropped back at school at 5:30pm for the first performance.
- Students will wear their costumes home when they get picked up on Wednesday evening.
- Teachers will hold on to their school bought accessories, such as headbands, etc. These will not go home.
- Students will NOT need to bring their costumes back in to school on Thursday. They will get changed at home before getting dropped back at school for the second performance, on Thursday at 5:30pm.

What if my child is attending Team Kids?

• Team Kids students leave their costumes in their reusable bag in their classroom at school. They will get changed at school with TK supervision.

PRODUCTION DROP OFF INFORMATION:

- Parents are to drop off students in their costumes at 5:30pm to their designated drop-off point (as listed below).
- Teachers will mark students on the roll on arrival and sign them out on departure. Students will be supervised for the duration of the event and will need to be signed out by a parent/carer at the end of the concert, at the designated pick up point.

What else do they need to bring?


- Please send your child with a water bottle.


