From our Principal:

Staggered Drop-offs / Pick-ups

As outlined in the COVID-safe practices attachment with last Friday's newsletter, we need to re-introduce staggered drop off and pick up times to help reduce the mixing of all members of the school community. This strategy, along with classroom/cohort bubbles and staggered break times for P-2 and 3-6 students, helps minimise the risk of COVID transmission. Reducing the mixing of students throughout the day as much as possible also helps with the initial contact tracing done by us if a case does infiltrate the school.

The staggered start and finish times commencing Monday are:

- Family surnames A-K: drop off between 8.50-9.00am and pick up at 3.20pm.
- Family surnames L-Z: drop off between 9.00-9.10am and pick up at 3.30pm.

I ask all families not to congregate around the school grounds or at the gates to support us in our efforts to keep Bell PS a COVID free school.


