From our Principal:

Management of COVID 19 in Schools

Further to our post to the community last night, an overview of the process for schools with a positive COVID case onsite is set out below, to provide parents/carers with greater clarity regarding our management of a positive COVID-19 case.

- 1. Schools alert DET as soon as they become aware that a student, parent, contractor or other member of the school community has tested positive to COVID-19, but only where the case was onsite within 48 hours prior to the onset of symptoms consistent with COVID-19.
- 2. DET <u>may</u> instruct the school to close for an initial 24 hours to allow for identification and notification of primary/secondary close contacts. *Please note that we* <u>have not</u> been instructed to close, as cleaning and contact identification has already taken place.
- 3. Schools contact the identified Primary Close Contacts (PCCs) and provide instructions regarding getting tested as soon as possible and quarantining until further guidance is provided by the Department of Health (DH). In primary schools, PCCs are likely to be limited to those in the same class as the confirmed COVID-19 case.
- 4. The school will complete the identification process using a spreadsheet provided by DET to determine PPCs. The completed spreadsheet is returned to DET who forward it to the local public health unit of DH.
- 5. The Department of Health will send an SMS to the PCCs advising them of their quarantine, testing and release dates. Primary school PCCs will be asked to isolate until they clear a Day 13 test. If unvaccinated, they will be required to isolate for 14 days and can return to school after a Day 13 test. Please note that the quarantining requirements for PCCs are changing with the Rapid Antigen Testing Program being rolled out from November 15, however we are currently unsure whether this option will be made available to our Year 1 and 2 families. Students who were deemed PCCs will need to show evidence of their test status when they return to school.
- 6. Once cleaning has occurred and contact identification completed the school can reopen, if it had closed, and all eligible students and staff who were not identified as PCCs are able to attend onsite.

We have directly contacted all families of children in the Year 1 and Year 2 class who have been identified as a PCC. In those particular grades, they will be isolating for the required time as set out by the Department of Health (DH). The families in both impacted grades were given detailed instructions last night and will be supported by the school and DH throughout their isolation period. From Monday, these classes will return to remote and flexible learning while students are required to quarantine. Correspondence will be sent to families this afternoon with further details.

Schools who have active cases and are undertaking this process are involved in regular briefings at a regional level to provide relevant support and additional advice each day. We will continue to provide the community with updated information as needed.

If you or anyone in your family develops even the mildest of symptoms, please get tested.

We understand this is a concerning time for the community, so please do not hesitate to contact the school if the information above needs clarification after seeking advice from the DET COVID hotline via the contact details below.

Rapid Antigen Testing Program

As reported in the media earlier this week, the Department of Education and Training is currently working with the Department of Health to roll-out a state-wide program for any new COVID-19 exposures on school sites from Monday 15 November. The at-home Rapid Antigen Testing program is an **opt-in** program for unvaccinated, or partially vaccinated, students identified as a primary close contact (PCC) of a confirmed COVID-19 case.

As of Monday 15 November, Rapid Antigen Tests, along with test administration and interpretation information, would be provided to families who choose to opt-in to the program, **if** there were to be an exposure at our school after this date.

As the roll out for this is scheduled for Monday, at this stage we are unsure whether this will be made available to the Year 1 and 2 families notified last night that their child has been identified as a as primary close contact (PCC) of a confirmed COVID-19 case. During a DET briefing today, it was indicated that there may be information provided to us over the weekend. As soon as any information is made available to us, we will contact the families of PCCs directly if there is a change to quarantine requirements.

Parent Payments

During the week, information on voluntary 2022 Financial Contributions was sent out to parents/carers for each specific year level.

While a Parent Payment Form will be sent home at the beginning of the 2022 school year, with a summary of the voluntary financial contributions recommended for us to continue to provide quality programs with adequate resourcing, we are no longer able to provide parents/carers with a statement of fees.

Included in the document was a list of the items that the school recommend you purchase from Complete Office Supplies (COS) for your child to use and own for the 2022 school year. COS is a 100% Australian Family Owned & Operated school supplier that we have been working with to select the list of items your child needs to start the year if you choose to take this option.

Orders through COS are delivered direct to your home before school starts *however there are cut off dates*. We recommend that if you choose to purchase your child's stationery pack with COS, that you place your order by *Sunday 9 January 2022*. Alternatively, families may choose to <u>provide similar/same items yourself</u> through an alternative supplier for your child to own and use throughout the year.

Grade Combinations for 2022

Staff have commenced preparation work for developing our 2022 class combinations. As mentioned in last week's newsletter and sent out in a Compass post on Wednesday, parents/carers have the option to provide key information that helps us make an informed decision about 2022 grade combinations. Input is *optional* and must be through the Google Form via the following link: https://forms.gle/eumq5FpdxsFqG3Pw7

- Comments need to be solely about your child's specific needs; requests centred on the perceived performance or personality of a particular teacher will not be considered.
- We value parent/carer input, however there are no guarantees as ultimately staff must make professional judgements about grade combinations, taking into account all children's academic, social and emotional development and the current dynamics of each group.
- The deadline is <u>Thursday 18 November</u>. Late correspondence will not be taken into account as we have a set timeline to finalise this important process.
- There is a character limit so please be as concise as possible.

- Please refrain from sending additional emails to teachers, leadership or the school account as your thoughts about your children's placement next year will be entered on the Google Form for staff to consider.
- If we require any further clarification on the information provided, the relevant staff members will contact parents/carers directly.

Staff are committed to working collectively and consistently throughout this process, making the best decision we can using our professional observations and judgements. The goal is to give every child and teacher in every grade the opportunity for a <u>positive and predictable</u> start to their next year at Bell after another challenging year involving remote and flexible learning. We continue to ask for your support and trust throughout the transition process.

Leaving Bell at the End of the Year?

To assist us with 2022 planning, we ask that families who are leaving Bell PS let their grade teacher/s and/or the office staff know as soon as possible. Regardless of the reason, the earlier we know of family departures the more accurate our grade structures, staffing arrangements and student allocations can be. If your child is leaving Bell at the end of the year (*not* our Grade 6 students) we ask that you please complete a Student Transfer Form at the front office at your earliest convenience.

Optional 2022 Prep Transition Session

On Wednesday morning we held an optional transition session for our 2022 preps to become familiar with the school and classroom environment. Despite the weather, we had a great turnout and parents/carers were able to meet other Prep families, while our 2022 Prep students were able to make connections with peers and our current prep teachers.



Parentline:

Parentline is a phone service for parents and carers of children from birth to 18 years old. They offer confidential and anonymous counselling and support on parenting issues.

- connect parents with services in their area.

Support for your kids to get active

Does your child love sport and being active? Does your family have a Health Care Card or Pensioner Concession Card? You may be eligible for up to \$200 to put towards the cost of your child's participation in physical activities.

As children return to sport over the coming months, the Get Active Kids Voucher Program helps <u>eligible families get their kids involved in organised sport and active recreation activities.</u>

Under the program, children may be eligible to receive up to \$200 to help with the cost of membership and registration fees, uniforms, and equipment. The program also provides a special consideration stream to support children residing in care services as well as temporary or provisional visa holders, undocumented migrants or international students.
