2022 Transition (Step-Up) Sessions

Yesterday, all students had a taste of next year which was the first step towards a transition to the higher grade in 2022. Students went up as a whole group and worked with the current teachers in that level, however teachers are yet to be allocated to their 2022 roles. This information will be published along with the final grade structures in the coming weeks.

The second session of the Step-Up Program is scheduled for next Friday 3 December and groups will be randomly mixed for a taste of Numeracy. Final grade combinations and their actual teacher for 2022 will be part of session 3 on Friday 10 December. I would like to reiterate the rigorous transition process undertaken this term which aims to give every child and teacher in every grade the opportunity for a positive start to their next year at Bell.

Masks Reminder

I ask all families to seriously consider sending your child to school with their own mask with their name on it if possible. See below for details but our supply is constantly under pressure with some children going through many disposable ones on any given day. In my mind, it is clear that for the isolated outbreaks we have experienced, mask wearing along with natural ventilation and sanitising reduces the risk of COVID transmission.

Farewell from the Office and New Role

It is with great sadness that we farewell Claudia Appel from the office as she moves into her chosen career within the legal profession. After completing studies earlier in the year, it is time to embark on her passion for the law and we wish her all the very best. Her work with enrolments, attendance, medications and first aid have been enormous.

We are fortunate to be able to transition one of our existing Education Support staff members from an Integration role to an Admin Assistant. Jessie Storm will be trained in her new administration roles overtime, and we are confident she will be a wonderful asset in the office just as she has been an outstanding support for our children with additional needs.

Camps and Swimming Carnival

The Grade 4 and 5 students will finally get to their camps that were postponed earlier in the year for one obvious reason. The Grade 4s head to the Bike Ed camp in Maldon next Monday to Wednesday and I hope it is a blast for them as they had the disappointment of not going in Term 2, and no lead up sleepover last year either. The Grade 5s have an action-packed week starting with their camp to Anglesea from Tuesday 7 to Wednesday 8 December, with an extra 'fun-filled Friday' of that week to round off their Outdoor Ed experience. This group missed out on the Maldon Camp last year and the sleepover the year before, therefore it's wonderful they can get to a camp after two years of missed opportunities.

The inaugural Bell PS Swimming Carnival is on Thursday 9 December and this is an event Josh and I have been keen to introduce for a number of years. As explained in the information out on Compass, it's a program for Grades 3-6 students to promote aquatic activities for all levels of ability.

The aim is for maximum participation in the novelty/fun events, whilst also running some more formal swimming trials for those who want to be considered for the swimming squad that will represent the school at the District Carnival early next year. Hence, the reason to take Grade 3s along with the older years.

There will be more information about our general swimming program at the start of next year but we are excited that the annual carnival and expanded swimming lessons from Prep to Grade 5 will establish a more comprehensive swimming and aquatic program at Bell PS. After all, we do live on a giant island.

Current Assembly Arrangements

In recent weeks we have re-commenced assemblies on Mondays on the Astroturf, but we are alternating between Prep-2 and Gr 3-6 each week due to the necessity of COVID restrictions and the bubbles we have in place. This Monday is the Gr 3-6 and the following week is P-2 for those who can make it down. Parents are welcome and are asked to still QR code at this point in time if you enter a building.

Final Day - Dismissal Time

As is the usual arrangement, the last day of the school year will **end at 1.30pm**. Restrictions around large gatherings are easing and we hope to run a whole school assembly leading up to the early finish time. More details to come once the revised Operations Guide arrives.





You will see a *green notification* in the top right hand corner above your Newsfeeds indicating Event Consent is required.

Support for your kids to get active

Does your child love sport and being active? Does your family have a Health Care Card or Pensioner Concession Card? You may be eligible for up to \$200 to put towards the cost of your child's participation in physical activities.

As children return to sport over the coming months, the Get Active Kids Voucher Program helps <u>eligible families get their kids involved in organised sport and active recreation activities.</u>

Under the program, children may be eligible to receive up to \$200 to help with the cost of membership and registration fees, uniforms, and equipment. The program also provides a special consideration stream to support children residing in care services as well as temporary or provisional visa holders, undocumented migrants or international students.

Reminder: Preston Level Crossing Removal Project 24 hour works, November and December 2021

Four level crossings will be removed as part of the Victorian Government's commitment to remove 85 dangerous and congested crossings across Melbourne.

The Preston Level Crossing Removal Project will be undertaking 24-hour works within the rail corridor between Croxton Station, Northcote, and Regent Street, Preston from:

- 8pm Monday 29 November to 3am Friday 3 December; and
- 8pm Thursday 9 December to 3am Tuesday 14 December 2021

During these times the project will install essential rail bridge and station infrastructure; continue piling works on the north and south abutments; install signalling and overhead power infrastructure; and remove redundant cabling and services.

Changes to the way you travel

There will be traffic management in place during both work periods to provide project vehicles and equipment safe access to the rail corridor. There may be some delays for vehicles at these locations. Please follow signage and instructions to move safely around work zones.

Road closure at the level crossing on Cramer Street:

7pm Tuesday 30 November to 5am Wednesday 1 December 2021

Single lane closures on Murray Road from:

- 8pm Monday 29 November to 3am Friday 3 December; and
- 8pm Thursday 9 December to 3am Tuesday 14 December 2021

Traffic will be maintained in both directions.

Pedestrian rail crossing closures

To safely carry out works, the following pedestrian rail crossings will be closed throughout both work periods:

- Olver Street (along Railway Reserve Bike Path)
- Regent Street (southern footpath crossing)



Preston Station and Bell Station will be closed for the duration of works. Please follow signage to bus replacement services.

Railway Reserve Bike path closure

The Railway Reserve Bike Path will be closed between Murray Road and Regent Street from:

- 8pm Monday 29 November to 3am Friday 3 December; and
- 8pm Thursday 9 December to 3am Tuesday 14 December 2021

Cyclist and pedestrian detours will be in place. Please follow any instructions from traffic management to help you safely move around the area. Local access to private properties and businesses will be maintained.

Rail disruption

To allow for Preston level crossing removal works, Metro maintenance works and Metro Tunnel project works, buses replace trains on sections of the Mernda Line on various weeknights and weekends during November and December.

What to expect

The 24-hour works will include:

- · Increased activity along the rail corridor between Croxton Station, Northcote and Regent Street, Preston.
- Traffic management at Normanby Avenue, Hutton Street, Oakover Road, Bell Street, Cramer Street, Murray Road and Regent Street that may cause traffic delays.
- · Varying levels of noise from vehicles and machinery 24 hours a day
- · Temporary lighting towers and generators in place for night works

Health and safety

Works on the Preston Level Crossing Removal Project are progressing with strict COVIDsafe plans in place to help protect workers and the community. Strict processes are in place to check and record the vaccination status of workers entering construction sites.
