## From our Principal:

### Grade Structures for 2022

Next year we will be operating under a 19 grade structure with a reasonably balanced number of students within each year level cohort, allowing us to operate with all straight grades and no composites. This model will enable us to continue to offer students our current four Specialist classes (PE, Visual Art, Music and Italian) on a weekly basis. The moderate drop in numbers is due to another large cohort of Year 6s leaving (76) and an enrolment of mid 60s for new Preps coming to Bell next year. Our anticipated student enrolment number next year is 450 students, making our whole school average 23.7 students per grade which is similar to this year.

### Step-Up Sessions 2 and 3

The second transition session today is a taste of Numeracy with a mixed group of students from their grade level, where as the third session scheduled for next Friday 10 December is where students meet their 2022 teacher and classmates in their future room. Once more, I would like to reiterate the rigorous transition process undertaken this term which aims to give every child and teacher in every grade the opportunity for a positive start to their next year at Bell:

- Parent/carer input was about individual needs and other student-based concerns, as well as considering the students' friendships lists. However, there are no guarantees other than every child will be with at least one of their four nominated friends.
- Teachers are still working together in teams and cross referencing with other year levels, carefully taking into account all children's academic, social and emotional development and the dynamics of each group.
- Feedback from specialist teachers, and a final analysis from school leadership, will ensure grades lists are well balanced academically and socially. Teachers will be based on best fit for individual grades and year level teams.

During the final Step-Up Session on Friday 10 December, all students will be given a note to inform parents and carers of their grade placements. On that day we aim to make the session an enjoyable one and ask for parents/carers support afterwards to keep their children in a positive mindset about their new teacher and changes in classmates. We need to collectively support the children to embrace the exciting possibilities and work through the perceived challenges of a new year level.

In previous years, the school has received a small number of requests from parents to make changes after their child has spent time with a new teacher and classmates. Please be aware that I will not be changing our decisions regarding student placements, especially when perceived teacher performance is the reason for a last minute request. Critical, special circumstances may be considered, however expect my answer to be no.

### Tree Planting

We have had a flurry of garden action over the last few weeks with new plantings at both ends of the school. Last Friday, the Sustainability Club spent the day rejuvenating the gardens around the south oval with plants they purchased from a Landcare grant. Ably led by Ivy and Brett (our sustainability teacher leaders), the group organised all grades to come out and plant about 1000 tube stock along the Scotia Street and Oakover Road beds. Scroll down to pages 8-10 for the detailed report and some great action pictures.

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As outlined in the newsletter from 19 November, we had the Grade 5s work with Lucy Salt to plant some indigenous plants around the Northern PlaySpace. Page 8 of that newsletter has the details about the link to Darebin Council Rewilding Program which was facilitated by Grade 5 team leader Mr A. Thanks also to Brett Allen our Grade 2 teacher and landscape gardener expert. Previous newsletters can be found via a link on the front page of our website.

We had a number of parents respond to Lucy's call out on Compass prior to the planting to help weed the area which was greatly appreciated. If there are other families able to support the ongoing weed management of that part of the school, please contact the office and we can arrange some tools if you have the spare time. During the day the northern part of the school is not in use at the moment due to the split timetable and separate break times. Therefore, it is a free run if anyone wants some fresh air and happy to get their 'hands dirty' so to speak; gloves are available and highly recommended.

### **Assembly**

This Monday we are due for a Prep-2 assembly with the School Captains running the show in their wonderful style. Parents/carers are welcome but please remember to **QR code** using the posters nearby as that is still a requirement.

### **Final Day - Dismissal Time**

As is the usual arrangement, the last day of the school year will **end at 1.30pm**. Restrictions around large gatherings are easing and we hope to run a whole school assembly leading up to the early finish time. More details to come once the revised Operations Guide arrives.

### **Semester 2 Student Reports**

As was the case in 2020, the Department of Education and Training has adjusted the expectations of student reports for Semester 2 in recognition of the disruption to curriculum programs caused by COVID-19 and remote and flexible learning in Term 3 and early Term 4.

Teachers will provide a written report for the parent/carer of each student enrolled at the school for Semester 2 that will include:

- A general comment including student participation and engagement in the learning program offered in Semester 2 and a short description of any additional curriculum areas delivered and their progress;
- A description of the content taught in the areas of English and Mathematics;
- Teacher judgement against the Victorian Curriculum F-10 achievement standards for English and Mathematics;
- For Specialist subjects, a description of what was taught will be provided as well as a short comment on progress and achievement in their learning across the semester.

Semester 2 reports will be accessible online via Compass **next Friday 10 December**. Instructions on how to access reports via Compass will be sent out in a Newsfeed at this time. For readability, we suggest accessing your child's report on Compass via a computer or larger mobile device such as an iPad, rather than a mobile phone. Hard copies will be made available by request only. Please contact the office if you would like to make this request.

**Grade 6 parents:** please note that it is suggested you **print** a copy of your child's 2021 report - and any other report if required - as your Grade 6 child will no longer have a Bell PS Compass account after their last day of school, Friday 17 December.

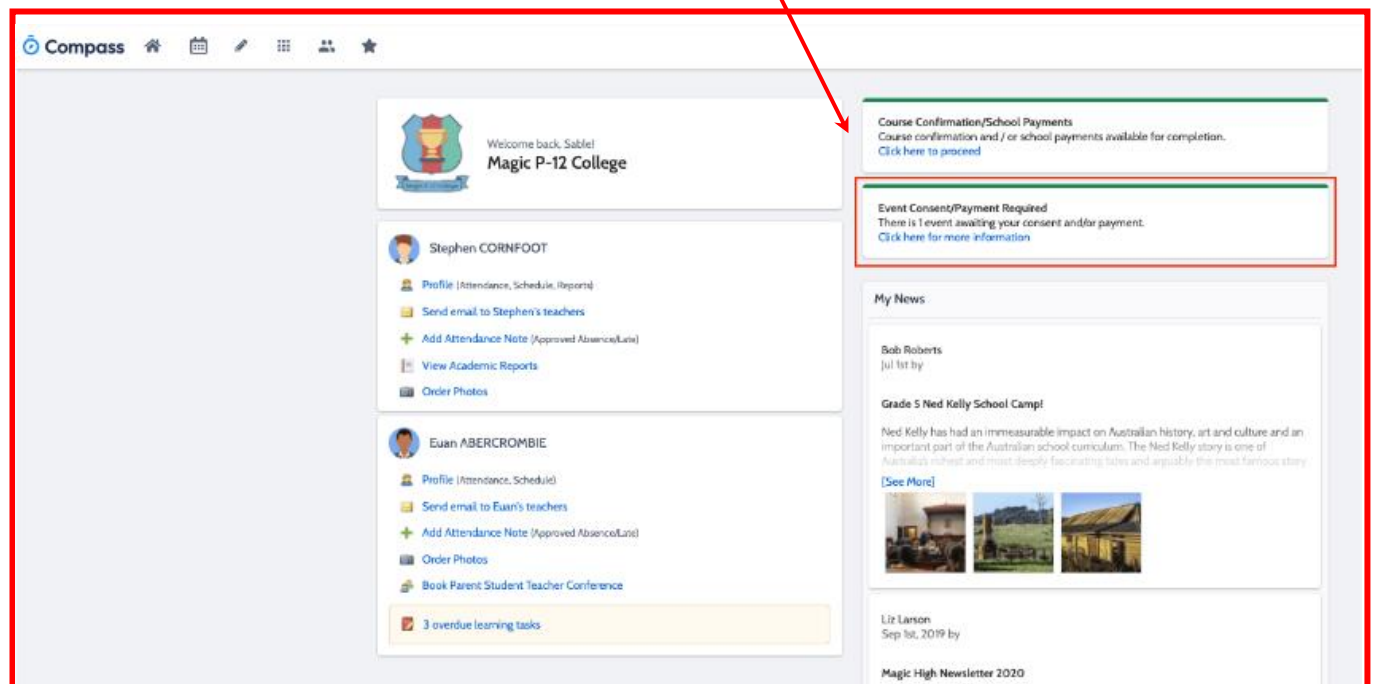
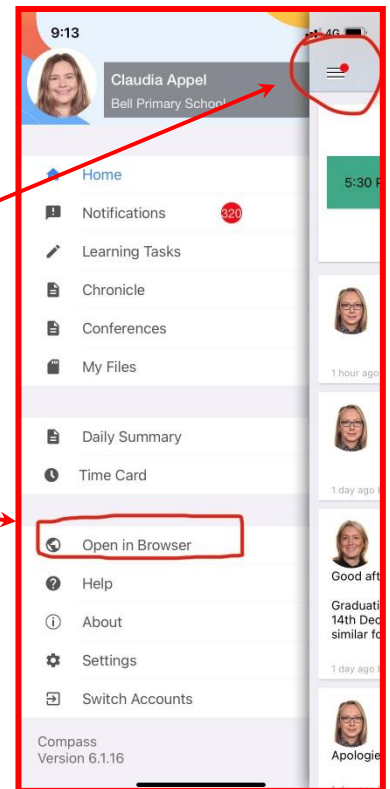

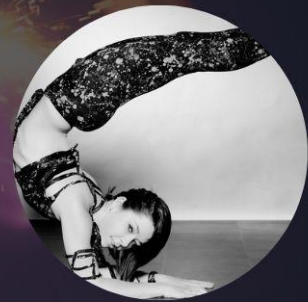
