From our Principal:

Grade Allocations and Step-Up Session 3

The third session of the Step-Up Program is this **Tuesday 12 December** and is when students meet their 2024 teacher/s and classmates in their future room. Once more, I would like to reiterate the extensive consultation process undertaken which aims to give every child and teacher the opportunity for a positive start to their next year. Steps included:

- Parent/carer and student input was sought and considered, however there are no guarantees other than every child will be with at least one of their nominated friends.
- Teachers have worked together in teams then cross-referenced with other levels and specialists when combining groups, taking into account children's academic, social/emotional development and the dynamics of each group.
- A final analysis was conducted by leadership ensuring grades are well balanced, both academically and socially.



During the final Step-Up Session on Tuesday, all students will be given a note to inform parents and carers of their grade placements. On that day, we aim to make the two hour session a focus on wellbeing and 'getting to know you' activities. I ask for support from parents/carers to keep their children in a positive mindset about their new teacher/s and changes in classmates. We need to collectively support them to be resilient and embrace the sometimes perceived challenges by reframing to exciting possibilities in the next year level with a new grade combination.

Occasionally I still get late requests from parents/carers to make changes after their child has spent time with a new teacher and classmates. Please be clear, I do not usually change decisions regarding student placements. Critical, special circumstances may be considered, however expect my answer to be no, especially when perceived teacher performance is the reason for a last-minute request.

Staffing Farewells and Welcomes for 2024

Every year there are the sad goodbye moments for staff who are leaving. I would like to thank the following teachers for their dedication to Bell as they depart for various reasons:

- Ajay Singh will be moving to a school much closer to his home to better support his family.
- Ange Georgiou will be taking next year off from teaching to explore other adventures in her life.
- Keara McIntyre will be transferring to a school very close to home which enables her to support her young family in a more time efficient way.
- Thom Chandler will be heading overseas on a teaching adventure starting in Europe.
- Timna Kopman, an Education Support staff member who has helped many of our students with additional needs, is heading interstate back to her family home.

From a school perspective, we are very fortunate to have had these staff members at Bell, some for a significant amount of time. They have been great contributors to their teaching teams and had an important impact on the children they have taught. I acknowledge that parents/carers may be saddened about these departures, but we must remember our school is part of the state education system that is every teachers' employer. Moving to other schools means our state system remains strong for all children.

Selecting new staff is an operational decision and ultimately my role as Principal. I am confident the following new staff will fit within the Bell approach and make valuable contributions to the school community. We welcome:

- **James Norman** and **Sarah Peters** who have been appointed to our school and we look forward to supporting them in the early stages of the year.
- **Nicola Howard, Matthew Jones** and **Sabina Harrington** who join us as more experienced teachers from within the state education system.
- **Julie Waugh** who returns in a part-time grade role after a year out of teaching in schools.
- **Lisa McLeish** who returns as the ongoing Learning Specialist after 18 months on maternity leave.

Another operational decision is deciding on what roles each staff member undertakes for next year. The leadership team of Emma, Xenia, Gab and myself have made the best and most balanced decisions to create collaborative combinations, ensuring there will be productive and engaging learning for the students at each year level.

STEAMS will be a new specialist subject that has an inquiry-based focus using elements of Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, Mathematics, and we have added Sustainability. This new weekly session for all students will provide some deeper learning into themes and units of work within the Victorian Curriculum. Alignment to the areas of focus in the various year levels will be a feature of Jack's planning and delivery each term.

Grade 6 Leadership for 2024

Many Grade 5 students are currently embarking on the selection process for 2024 School and House Captains, with speeches to be presented next week to help shortlist candidates. From the shortlisted students, Emma and I will conduct some 'round table' discussions in small groups to finalise the four School Captains. Similarly, the shortlisted House candidates will be interviewed by staff in their House to then recommend House Leaders to Emma and me.

The remaining Grade 6 leadership positions will be finalised as early as possible next year, starting with Junior School Council (JSC) in the first week of school. We will be using several processes such as speeches and voting, written applications, interviews and preferences, with relevant staff involved to give all those students keen to step up their best chance of success in one of the many leadership opportunities.

Gym/Hall Kick Off Meeting

It was pleasing to be involved in a highly productive set-up meeting on Wednesday with key members of ARC3 (the new builder), VSBA and Atelier-Wagner (the architects). We expect to see action on the site from late next week to embark on the remaining scope of works from early January. I do not have an exact date of completion yet however, barring any major issues, we should see the works finished in the early part of 2024.

SEMESTER REPORTS

Semester 2 reports will be accessible to parents/carers online via Compass early next week. A Compass Newsfeed will be sent out to notify you once reports have been made live. Your child's report documents their achievement against the Victorian Curriculum and includes:

- Achievement comments for key curriculum areas
- A progression point indicating your child's progress along a learning continuum for key learning areas
- An evaluation of Work Habits in the areas of effort and behaviour for the classroom/yard as well as specialist subjects

We encourage parents/carers to share and discuss your child's report with them. Reports are an opportunity to celebrate areas of strength and individual progress throughout the semester and year. Encouraging your child to reflect on their achievements supports their self-efficacy and agency over their learning. Talking about what might help them in areas they're doing well in, as well as those they may find challenging, can assist with supporting future progress, effort and engagement and further develops the crucial home-school partnership.

For readability, we suggest accessing your child's report on Compass via a computer or larger mobile device such as an iPad rather than a mobile phone. On the Compass app, select your child's photo then select the 'Reports' tab. Hard copies will be made available by request only. Please contact the office if you require a hard copy.

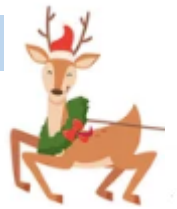

In a final push to finish the work we've been doing around the grounds before the end of the year, we are holding weekday working bees over the next two weeks!

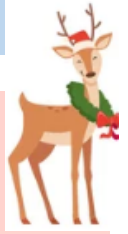


