From our Assistant Principal:

Semester Reports

Semester 2 reports are now accessible to parents/carers online via Compass. Your child's report documents their achievements against the Victorian Curriculum, and includes:

- Achievement comments for key curriculum areas
- A progression point indicating your child's progress along a learning continuum for key learning areas
- An evaluation of Work Habits in the areas of effort and behaviour for the classroom/yard as well as specialist subjects

We encourage parents/carers to share and discuss your child's report with them. Reports are an opportunity to celebrate areas of strength and individual progress throughout the semester and year. Encouraging your child to reflect on their achievements supports their self-efficacy and agency over their learning. Talking about what might help them in areas they're doing well in, as well as those they may find challenging, can assist with supporting future progress, effort and engagement and further develops the crucial home-school partnership.

For readability, we suggest accessing your child's report on Compass via a computer or larger mobile device such as an iPad rather than a mobile phone. On the Compass app, select your child's photo then select the 'Reports' tab. Hard copies will be made available by request only. Please contact the office if you require a hard copy.

Start of Next Year

A reminder that the state-wide pupil free day will be on **Tuesday 27 January**. On this day, families are welcome to drop in during the last session of the day, between 2:40-3:30pm, to visit their 2026 classroom and teacher. At this time, families who have ordered their child's book pack through COS will be able to collect this and take it home to label items.

We ask that all Grade 1-6 students bring their entire book pack to school on their first day, **Wednesday 28 January**. Teachers will store additional items in the classroom to ensure they are readily accessible when items run out.

For 2026 Prep students, Wednesday 28 January will be the drop-in day. The Prep team has allocated specific drop-in times for families which have been communicated via Compass in previous days.

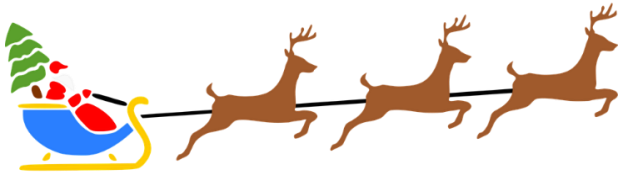

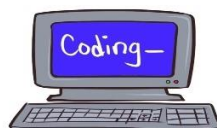

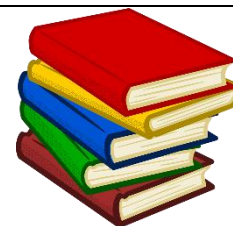
Sign Ins and Sign Outs

Lost Library Book Procedure

If your child has lost a school library book, please follow the steps below:

1. On the Qkr! app, select Bell Primary School -> Payments -> Lost library book
2. Make a payment of \$5 per lost book
3. Email a screenshot of your receipt and child's name to bell.ps@education.vic.gov.au
4. School staff will then remove the lost/overdue book from your child's library account



Working With Children Checks + Volunteer Inductions

Parents/carers who intend to participate in any volunteering with the school (eg reading, excursion support, etc) **must** hold a current Working With Children Check card. Even if you don't have your name down for any volunteering on the immediate horizon, we strongly suggest applying for a WWCC as soon as possible- a Volunteer WWCC is free! List Bell Primary on your WWCC application and we will automatically receive a copy in the mail for our records, or you can supply your card to the front office for us to add to our parent/carer register. If you are a current VIT card holder, you can provide to the office in lieu of a WWCC.



NB- if you are volunteering with activities onsite that don't involve working directly with students (eg organising resources, fundraising stall set-up, etc), you must still hold a valid WWCC and supply it to the office.

Great news! We absolutely smashed our book club goal! We managed to raise \$2,448 for the school library - it's our best ever book club edition.

Some highlights:

- We had 180 families order books - the biggest participation we've ever had
- 698 books were ordered
- 2A was the most book-ish class with 64 books ordered.
- The top three classes in terms of number of books ordered were 2A, 2B and 3C
- Year 2 loved book club the most - the total number of books ordered by Year 2 was 161
- Year 1 and Year 3 tied for second place, both year levels ordered 128 books

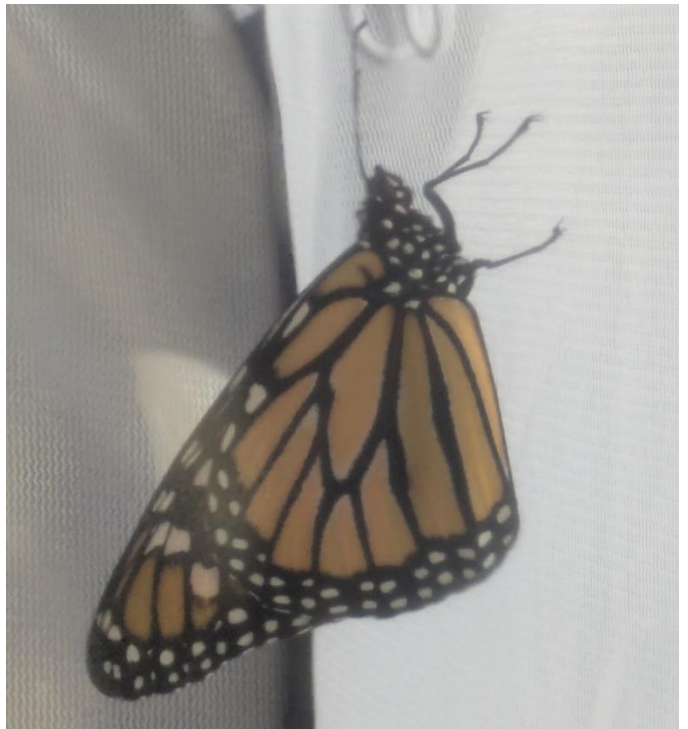

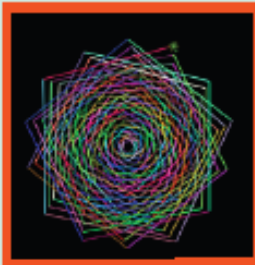
