### Start of Next Year

The state-wide pupil-free day will be held on **Tuesday 27 January**. Families are invited to drop in during the final session, **from 2:40–3:30pm**, to visit their child's 2026 classroom and meet their teacher/s. This visit provides a valuable opportunity for students to settle any first-day nerves, reconnect with their teacher/s, and become familiar with their new learning environment.

During this time, families who have ordered their child's book pack through COS will be able to collect it and take it home to label items. All students are asked to bring their complete book pack to school on the first day of term, **Wednesday 28 January**. Teachers will store additional items in classrooms, so they are readily accessible when required.

For 2026 Prep students, Wednesday, 28 January will operate as a drop-in day. The Prep team has allocated specific drop-in times for families, which have been communicated via Compass in recent days.

### **Staffing**

We wish to inform our community of a late staffing change for the coming year. Our Business Manager, Lu, has accepted a position at Whittlesea Secondary College, which is closer to home. Over the past three years, Lu has been an integral leader within our administration team. Her dedication and expertise have made a significant contribution to the smooth operation of the school.

We thank Lu for her commitment and wish her every success in this next chapter of her professional journey.

### **Newsletter**

Starting in 2026, our school newsletter will transition to a new format that can be easily viewed across devices and integrated with our portal. This update is designed to make accessing information easier. Key features of the new newsletter include:

- Compatibility with desktop, tablet, and mobile devices
- Integration with Compass and our school website
- Option to email subscribe for direct delivery
- Ability for readers to click on sections they wish to read
- Google translate capabilities

In addition, we will be exploring ways to streamline our calendar system across the website, Compass, and the Newsletter. This will allow parents and carers to view upcoming events more easily with the view to enabling a system that also allows them to add events directly to their personal calendars.

### **Parent/Carer Child Safe & OHS Induction**

As part of our Minimum Standards Audit this year, our induction processes for Child Safe and OHS were introduced. While this induction will still need to be completed each year, next year it will be transitioned to an online module which will make the process far more convenient for families. Parents and carers will be able to work through the content at a time that suits them. The link to the online modules will be uploaded to our website early next year and communicated via the Newsletter.

The above adjustments to school communication and processes reflect our ongoing commitment to ensuring families receive timely and accessible information that clearly communicates school updates, while meeting Child Safe and OHS requirements and acknowledging the busy lives of parents and carers.

### **External Providers**

As part of our ongoing review of Child Safe processes, from next year our external provider music programs that operate during or adjacent to the school day, will no longer be permitted to offer one-to-one tuition sessions.

While these providers are external organisations engaged directly by parents and carers, the sessions take place on school grounds and, as such, the school retains a duty of care for all students. This change ensures that our practices remain fully aligned with our Child Safety policies and continue to prioritise student safety and wellbeing at all times. We appreciate the understanding and support of our community as we implement this important adjustment.

### **David's Retirement Video**

There have been a number of requests from the community to access a copy of David's retirement video that was shown at our final assembly last term. A video link and password will be sent to all parents and carers this afternoon via a separate Compass Newsfeed.

We kindly ask that you do not distribute the link or password to anyone outside your household. Additionally, please do not upload any video snippets or still images from the video to social media. Thank you for your understanding and cooperation.

We encourage families to enjoy re-watching this together at home.

# From our Assistant Principal:

## Semester Reports

Semester 2 reports were made accessible to parents/carers online via Compass last week. Your child's report documents their achievements against the Victorian Curriculum, and includes:

- Achievement comments for key curriculum areas
- A progression point indicating your child's progress along a learning continuum for key learning areas
- An evaluation of Work Habits in the areas of effort and behaviour for the classroom/yard as well as specialist subjects

We encourage parents/carers to share and discuss your child's report with them. Reports are an opportunity to celebrate areas of strength and individual progress throughout the semester and year. Encouraging your child to reflect on their achievements supports their self-efficacy and agency over their learning. Talking about what might help them in areas they're doing well in, as well as those they may find challenging, can assist with supporting future progress, effort and engagement and further develops the crucial home-school partnership.

For readability, we suggest accessing your child's report on Compass via a computer or larger mobile device such as an iPad rather than a mobile phone. On the Compass app, select your child's photo then select the 'Reports' tab. Hard copies will be made available by request only. Please contact the office if you require a hard copy.

If your child or children are leaving Bell this year, please remember to print out any documents, reports, etc from your child's Compass profile. You will need to print them **prior to 1.30pm on Friday 19 December** as, after that time, the Admin Team must complete a DET End of Year procedure which removes exiting students from Bell PS Compass.

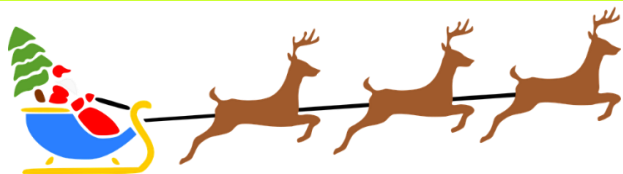

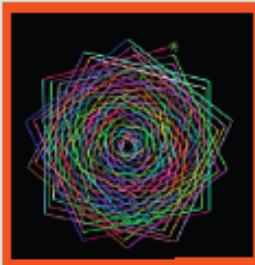
