From the Principal:

Bell FUNdraising Facilitator/Convenor

We are seeking one or two additional FUNdraising facilitators/convenors this year to work alongside our current convenor, Bridget Ah Ching. The role of the team of convenors is to oversee the planning of events for 2021. It is not to captain events, or do all the organisation for planned activities, rather support and encourage the effective and efficient operation of our school's FUNdraising activities. Some key points about the role are:

- The FUNdraising group is an important part of our school and is made up of parent volunteers who usually meet at a convenient scheduled time throughout the year to oversee all FUNdraising activities. Meetings might be face to face or online or a mix.
- The facilitators/convenors lead that group and ensure event captains and their teams are on track leading up to their particular event.
- The FUNdraising group do not get bogged down by formal meeting procedures, standing orders and labels such as presidents, etc. There are reporting requirements to the Finance Sub-committee of School Council, but they are handled by members of the Finance sub-committee, including me as Principal, who are the direct links to School Council.
- Financial accountabilities for each event, and the FUNdraising activities overall, will be supported by a member of the Finance sub-committee with accounting qualifications.

Curriculum Day 3

A reminder that the third pupil free day will be on Thursday 1 April, being the last day of term 1. This date was confirmed and published a number of times from late last year. The date was negotiated with the Berry Street organisation in collaboration with two other local schools; our staff will participate in professional learning for the final domain - Character.

Plans are also in motion to conduct a parent session on Monday 3 May to present key information on all five Berry Street Domains (Body, Relationships, Engagement, Stamina and Character) and where the Berry Street Educational Model will fit into our overall approach as we develop a whole school student wellbeing and engagement framework.

Planning Week

Next week's specialist timetable will look different as all Grade Level Teams, as well as the Specialist Team will have a day of collaborative planning to analyse and reflect on student learning progress this term, and then ensure there is consistent and relevant planning for next term. This approach is in its second year and enables teams to deliver more consistent content using similar instructional practices for all students in the cohort. Individual class teachers will always add their flavour to a lesson but learning intentions each week for every lesson are the same.

Logistically, Planning Week means the grade gets all its specialist subjects on the one day, with a CRT sometimes covering a session or two during the day. Planning week only happens once per term meaning the regular routines remain the same for the rest of the term.

Missed Calls

Please do not call the school if you have received a 'missed call' notification. Bell PS Staff are advised they must leave a message where possible which may take a minute or two to arrive on your phone, so please wait to check. Many messages are just a 'courtesy' call and do not require a reply.

Parent Messages for Students

To ensure 'change of plan' messages are communicated to your child/ren in time, please ensure you contact the office as early in the day as possible. Ideally, 'end of day' messages (3.20-3.30pm) via the office should be avoided as much as possible, given the challenge of communicating details to students in the midst of busy packing-up time in a classroom.

Messages to remind students to attend OSH Club are unnecessary as OSH Club staff always make 'reminder' announcements for students who are booked in but have not yet shown up.

The ONLY thing we need **you** to do is either sign in LATE at the office (WITH YOUR CHILD), or sign out EARLY at the office **before** collecting your child.

Emailing the teacher to advise details is ENTIRELY OPTIONAL.

Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund Applications

The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities. If you have a valid means-tested concession card, such as a *Veterans Affairs Gold Card*, *Centrelink Health Care Card* or *Pensioner Concession Card*, or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible. There is also a special consideration category for asylum seeker and refugee families.

The payment amount this year is \$125 for eligible primary school students. Payments are made direct to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions and sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

If you applied for CSEF through our school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year, unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

If you would like to apply for the first time, please contact the school office on 9480 5622 to request an application form. You can also download the form, and find out more about the program and eligibility, on the Department of Education and Training's Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund web page. Please return completed forms to the school office as soon as possible. *CSEF Applications close for 2021 on Monday 21 June.*

Bell Primary School is committed to the safety and wellbeing of all children and young people. This will be the primary focus of our care and decision-making.


Bell Primary School has zero tolerance for child abuse.








Skill up for family bike riding
